Report on the Administration of Criminal and Civil Justice in the Province of Sind for the year 1930.

PRELIMINARY REMARKS.

The area of the territories to which the statements relate is 46,506 square miles, and the population 3,885,308 according to the Census of 1931.

- 2. The Court of the Judicial Commissioner was presided over by Mr. P.E. Percival, C.I.E., I.C.S., from 1st January to 1st May 1930 and by Mr. A. C. Wild, I.C.S., from 2nd May to 31st December 1930.
- 3. The following were the Additional Judicial Commissioners:—
 - (1) Mr. A. H. S. Aston, Bar.-at-law, from 1st January to 6th February 1930.
 - (2) Mr. Rupchand Bilaram, LL.B., from 1st January to 31st December 1930.
 - (3) Mr. A. C. Wild, I.C.S., from 1st January to 1st May 1930.
 - (4) Mr. M. A. Havelivala, Bar.-at-law, from 7th February to 31st December 1930.
 - (5) Mr. R. B. Milne, I.C.S., from 3rd June to 31st December 1930.
- 4. The Judicial Commissioner's Court was closed for the annual vacation from 12th May to 11th June 1930.
 - 5. There were on 31st December 1930:—
 - 3 Sessions Judges.
 - 4 Additional Sessions Judges and 2 First Class Sub-Judges invested with Assistant Sessions Judge's powers.
 - 8 District Magistrates, including the City Magistrate, Karachi, who is also Additional District Magistrate, Karachi.
 - 160 Stipendiary Magistrates.
 - 28 Honorary Magistrates.

Besides the above there were 16 Benches of Magistrates inclusive of those in the City of Karachi, constituted from among 89 Honorary Magistrates.

- 6. There were on the 31st December 1930:-
 - 3 District Judges.
 - 4 Assistant Judges.
 - 2 Small Cause Court Judges (including the Registrar, Karachi Small Causes Court, Karachi).
 - 4 First Class Sub-Judges.
 - 17 Second Class Sub-Judges, including 4 Mukhtiarkarswho are also Joint Sub-Judges and 1 temporary Second Class Sub-Judge.
- 7. The annual cold weather tour for the inspection of the Courts in Sind was made in December 1930 and January 1931 by the Judicial Commissioner. He inspected the District and Sessions Courts and the First Class Sub-Courts of Hyderabad, Sukkur and Larkana and the First Class Sub-Court, Shikarpur; the Courts of the Sub-Judges of Mehar, Naushahro Feroze, Shahdadpur, Tando Muhammad Khan and Mirpurkhas; the Court of the Sub-Judge, Rohri from Sukkur; the Courts of the Sub-Judges and First Class Magistrates of Sehwan, Jacobabad and Tatta; the City Magistrates' Courts of Shikarpur, Sukkur and Hyderabad; the Additional City Magistrate's Court, Hyderabad; the First Class Magistrates' Courts of Sehwan, Larkana, Jacobabad, Shikarpur, Sukkur, Hyderabad, Naushahro Feroze, Shahdadpur, Tando Muhammad Khan, Mirpurkhas and Tatta; and the Courts of the Resident Magistrates of Mehar, Larkana, Rohri, Naushahro Feroze and Tando Muhammad Khan.
- 8. The District Judge and the Assistant Judge, Hyderabad, inspected the Subordinate Civil Courts of Tando Muhammad Khan and Mirpurkhas, respectively; the District Judge and the Assistant Judge, Sukkur, inspected the Subordinate Civil Courts of Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Sukkur and Rohri, respectively; and the District Judge, Larkana, inspected the Subordinate Civil Court of Mehar.
- 9. The Deccan Agriculturists' Relief Act is reported to be working fairly satisfactorily in the Province. Certain sections of the Act, however, are not working satisfactorily, and some amendments in the Act appear to be desirable.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

- 10. The number of offences reported and those returned as true during the year under review are 36,820 and 35,626, respectively, and show a decrease of 3,575 and 3,255 as compared with the figures of the preceding year, which are 40,395 and 38,881, respectively.
- 11. There was a corresponding decrease in the number of cases brought to trial from 39,667 to 37,817. There was an increase in the number of persons under trial from 60,891 to 63,984. The number of persons remaining under trial at the end of the year under report fell from 6,951 to 6,688. The total number of persons under trial during the year under review before the several Criminal Courts, including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner was 64,322.

The fines in 1930 amounted to Rs. 2,65,357-6-1 as against Rs. 2,39,470-8-5 and compensation paid to accused persons in 1930 amounted to Rs. 22,203-14-9 as against Rs. 10,585-8-0.

13. Particulars of the results of trials of persons in the different districts (including persons in the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind) are given in Appendix A.

The large number of acquittals or discharges compared with that of convictions is due to the fact that a number of cases were compounded or withdrawn.

- 14. The work done by the various Sessions Courts (including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind for the last three years is shown in Appendix B.
- 15. The number of offences affecting life and attempts at such offences fell from 376 to 367 in the year under report. A large portion of this class of crime arose from intrigues or supposed intrigues with women. In the Upper Sind Frontier district 51 cases of murder and culpable homicide not amounting to murder were tried under the Sind Frontier Regulation III of 1892. Out of these in 34 cases the motive was connected with women.
- 16. There was an increase in the number of offences reported under the following heads:—

 - (5) Affecting the public health, safety, convenience decency and morals.

 - (16) Criminal intimidation, insult and annoyance.

There was a decrease in the number of offences reported under the following heads:—

- 17. The number of individual appeals disposed of in the year under report was 2,824, that is, 14 less than in the preceding year. Out of these sentences were left unaltered in 2,147 cases and were reversed or varied in 633. The sentences were maintained intact in 76 per cent. of appeals against 75.75 per cent. in the previous year.

The above appeals were thus distributed :--

- (1) Magistrates' Courts ... 328
- (2) Sessions Courts (including Judicial 2,112 Commissioner's Court).
- (3) Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (High Court Jurisdiction).

The criminal appeals in the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind and the Sessions Courts show an increase of 1 and 166, respectively, and those in the Courts of Magistrates show a decrease of 181.

- 18. During the year under report the cases of 194 persons were examined in revision by the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (High Court Jurisdiction). The Sessions Courts examined the cases of 200 persons and the District Magistrates of 23. The principal results of this revision were that the sentences of 29 persons were reversed, of 6 persons altered, and the cases of 112 persons were otherwise disposed of.
- 19. The criminal work disposed of by the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (High Court Jurisdiction) in the year under report as compared with that of 1929 and the arrears at the end of the year are shown in Appendix C.

The cases of 40 persons were referred to the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind for confirmation of the sentence of death. In the case of 22 the sentence of death was confirmed; in the case of 8 the sentence was commuted to that of transportation for life; in the case of 2 the conviction and sentence was reversed and the accused were acquitted; and the cases of 8 persons were pending at the close of the year.

CIVIL JUSTICE.

20. The total number of civil suits instituted in Sind during the year under report was 41,546 as compared with 38,969 in 1929. The number in each of the District Courts, including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (District Court Jurisdiction), filed in the two years was:—

22. The total value of suits filed during the year under report was Rs. 1,51,50,915-1-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ as compared with Rs. 1,61,13,846-14-10 in 1929 and Rs. 1,53,82,648-14-6 in 1928.

23. The total number of suits disposed of was 41,487 as against 38,834 in the preceding year. The following table exhibits the manner of disposal in 1930 as compared with the year 1929:—

^{24.} The number of suits pending at the close of the year was 12,104 as against 11,088 in the previous year. In the Judicial Commissioner's Court the number pending was 481 as against 656.

^{25.} The average duration of constested and uncontested suits in the District Courts, including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (District Court Jurisdiction), was 507 and 108 days, respectively, in the year under report as against 423 and

- 195 days, respectively, in 1929. In the Subordinate Courts the average duration of contested and uncontested suits was 147 and 70 days and in the Karachi Small Causes Court it was 130 and 54 days, respectively.
- 26. The number of Miscellaneous Judicial cases for disposal before the Courts was 2,541 as against 1,905 in 1929. The number disposed of was 1,762 as against 1,346 in 1929.
- 27. The average duration of contested and uncontested Miscellaneous cases in the District Courts, including the Judicial Commissioner's Court (District Court Jurisdiction), was 164 and 67 days, respectively. In the Judicial Commissioner's Court in its High Court Jurisdiction it was 962 and 78 days, respectively. In the Subordinate Courts the average duration of contested and uncontested Miscellaneous cases was 161 and 71 days, while in the Small Cause Courts it was 214 and 73 days, respectively.
- 28. The number of Civil Appeals before the District Courts was 711 as against 641 in 1929. Of these 273 were disposed of as compared with 247 in 1929. The number of Civil Appeals disposed of during the year under report as contrasted with the preceding year is as follows:—

^{29.} The average duration of contested and uncontested regular appeals in the District Courts during the year under report was 481 and 154 days, respectively. In the Judicial Commissioner's Court in its High Court Jurisdiction it was 1,230, and 29 days, respectively.

^{30.} The number of Miscellaneous Appeals for disposal before the Courts including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (District and High Court Jurisdiction) was 298 as against 316 in 1929. Of these 161 were disposed of and the number disposed of in the previous year was the same. The number of

31. The average duration of contested and uncontested Miscellaneous Appeals in the District Courts including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (District Court Jurisdiction) was 225 and 108 days, respectively. In the Judicial Commissioner's Court in its High Court Jurisdiction it was 997 and 18 days, respectively.

The high average duration appearing against the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind both in its District and High Court Jurisdictions is due to special efforts having been made to dispose of old cases and appeals and many old cases and appeals having been disposed of during the year under report.

- 32. There were in all 35,002 applications for execution before the Civil Courts, including the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind, as against 29,819 in 1929. Of these 27,543 were disposed of as against 24,519 in 1929 The amount realized in execution of decrees during the year under report was Rs. 19,12,697-5-4 as compared with Rs. 16,48,012-10- $4\frac{1}{2}$ in the year 1929. Moveable property was sold in 216 cases as against 229 in 1929, and attached but subsequently released in 333 as against 341 in 1929.
- 33. 376 insolvency petitions were presented during the year as against 281 in 1929 Out of 497 petitions for disposal before the Courts in the Province of Sind, 321 were disposed of, leaving a balance of 176. The number of insolvents discharged was 152 as against 96 in 1929. The orders of adjudication in respect of 28 debtors were annulled in the Judicial Commissioner's Court. The number of undischarged insolvents in the said Court was 249.

- 34. During the year under report there were no references made nor appeals filed under sections 27 and 30, respectively, of the Workmen's Compensation Act, VIII of 1923.
- 35. At the opening of the year 1 application for leave to appeal to the Privy Council was pending for orders in the Judicial Commissioner's Court. Eight new applications were filed during the year making a total of 9. Of these 4 were dismissed, and 5 applications were pending at the close of the year.
- 36. Appendix D shows the Civil work disposed of by the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sind (High Court Jurisdiction) during the year under report as contrasted with that of 1929 and the arrears awaiting disposal.

GENERAL.

- 37. There has been a slight increase in the civil work and a slight decrease in the criminal work in the year under report, which however does not call for any comment.
- 38. As observed in the last year's report, Government owing to financial stringency have again postponed the establishment of a Chief Court for Sind and the creation of a new Judicial District of Nawabshah.
