REPORT ON THE RAIL AND RIVER-BORNE TRADE OF THE PROVINCE OF SIND AND BRITISH BALUCHISTAN FOR THE YEAR 1915-16.

The following changes were made from 1st April 1915 in the classified list of articles comprising the Rail and River-borne Trade of India :—

The existing sub-heads of Treasure were re-cast as under :—

1. Gold coin.
2. Gold bullion.
3. Silver coin (Government Rupees).
4. Silver bullion (namely, Bars, ingots and coin other than current coin of the Government of India).
5. Nickel coin.
6. Bronze or copper coin.

The arrangement of the blocks and the system of registration remained unchanged.

GENERAL REMARKS.

2. The inundation of 1915, both in Sind and the Punjab, was very low and the monsoon deficient. The area put under cultivation was below that of the last year. The Rabi crop of 1914-15 was, however, very satisfactory both in Sind and the Punjab. The increase in imports and the decrease in exports was due to larger quantities of coal having been obtained by Karachi as well as by places inland direct from the mines by rail owing to shortage of steamer tonnage.

3. North-Western Railway.—The increase in mileage during the year 1915-16 was as follows :—

4. Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway.—The following particulars have been supplied by the Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway :—

Five new crossing stations have been opened on the main line from Kuchaman Road to Hyderabad (Sind) and one more is under construction.

The administration continues as usual to add to and improve the watering arrangements.

The conversion of the Hyderabad-Mirpurkhas Section into broad gauge has not yet been commenced, but the extra land required is being acquired.

The Ratangarh-Sardarshahr line was opened to public traffic on 1st March 1916. A short branch of 4 miles was also opened for traffic from Jaswantgarh station on the Degana-Hissar Section to the important town of Ladnun on the 20th December 1915.

8. The total quantity and value of trade, both External and Internal, exclusive of Animals, living, and Treasure, showed an advance of maunds 5,035,231 or 8·7 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 7½ crores or 21 per cent. in value as compared with the preceding year, but the figures are lower than those of any previous year since 1911-12.

It will be observed that the imports into Karachi rose from maunds 36,373,957 in 1914-15 to maunds 44,605,847 during the year under report, exhibiting an increase of maunds 8,231,890 or 23 per cent. due to heavy imports of coal and coke, hay, straw and grass, grain, rice not in the husk, grain and pulse other sorts and rapeseed. Wheat, however, showed a decline.

Exports, on the other hand, showed a falling off of maunds 5,624,244 or 37 per cent. when compared with the figures of the previous year. They are the smallest since the year 1904-05. The decline was due to the cessation of exports of coal and coke arriving by sea for consumption upcountry.

9. Imports from the External blocks during the year under comment showed an advance of maunds 10,516,365 or 36 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 4,21,78,805 or 30 per cent in value as compared with the previous year. They rose from maunds 28,824,300 and Rs. 13,79,08,245 in 1914-15 to maunds 39,340,665 and Rs. 18,00,87,050 in 1915-16. Although the figures, when compared with the quinquennial year 1911-12, showed a fall of maunds 13,287,747 or 25 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 3,15,81,859 or 15 per cent. in value, they were nevertheless maunds 10,068,461 or 34 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 7,43,25,548 or 70 per cent. in value above those of the decennial year, *viz.*, 1906-07.

10. Exports to the External blocks showed a fall of maunds 2,848,245 or 27 per cent. in quantity and a rise in value of Rs. 69,04,283 or 6 per cent. when compared with the previous year, the figures for the last two years being maunds 10,643,435 and Rs. 11,33,36,819 and maunds 7,795,190 and Rs. 12,02,41,102, respectively. The figures are the smallest since the year 1906-07, the first year of the decade.

11. The Internal and local trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan showed a decline of maunds 2,632,888 or 14 per cent. in quantity, having fallen from maunds 18,508,404 in the previous year to maunds 15,875,516 in the year under notice; but it rose in value from Rs. 11,23,18,515 in 1914-15 to Rs. 14,10,49,089 in the past year, exhibiting an increase of Rs. 28,730,574 or 25 per cent. Imports into Karachi from Sind and British Baluchistan during the year under report showed an advance of maunds 429,082 or 4 per cent. and Rs. 242,41,420 or 40 per cent., having risen from maunds 11,340,505 and Rs. 6,00,74,735 in 1914-15 to maunds 11,769,587 and Rs. 8,43,16,155 in 1915-16. The figures are the highest yet recorded. The increase is chiefly noticeable under hay, straw and grass, jawar and bajra, rice not in the husk, other food grains and wool, raw. Exports, on the other hand, showed a decline of maunds 3,061,971 or 43 per cent. in quantity, having dwindled from maunds 7,167,899 in 1914-15 to maunds 4,105,928 during the

year under comment. The value, however, rose from Rs. 5,22,43,780 in 1914-15 to Rs. 5,67,32,934 during the year just ended, showing an increase of Rs. 44,89,154 or 8 per cent. The export trade is the smallest since the year 1906-07 but shows an advance of maunds 123,395 or 3 per cent. over the year 1905-06. The fall was chiefly noticeable under Coal and coke.

An explanation of the causes of fluctuations in the principal commodities is given below in paragraphs 18, 24 and 25.

I.—EXTERNAL TRADE.

IMPORTS.

12. The import trade with the Punjab exhibited an increase of maunds 319,561 or 1 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 1,81,14,770 or 14 per cent. in value, having risen from maunds 25,519,046 and Rs. 12,47,78,141 in 1914-15 to maunds 25,838,607 and Rs. 14,28,92,911 during the year under report. The chief articles that contributed to the rise are—

The imports from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh showed a rise of maunds 3,913,469 or 485 per cent. and Rs. 1,67,80,187 or 316 per cent. when compared with the previous year, the figures for the last two years being maunds 805,886 and Rs. 5,310,515 and maunds 4,719,355 and Rs. 2,20,90,702, respectively. The imports from the Presidency and Bombay Port showed an improvement of maunds 9,068 or 8 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 13,12,612 or 68 per cent. in value, the figures for the last two years being maunds 108,410 and Rs. 19,05,984 and maunds 117,478 and Rs. 32,18,596, respectively. The increase occurred principally under —

15. Imports from Bengal, including the Port of Calcutta, rose from maunds 578,117 and Rs. 22,44,032 in 1914-15 to maunds 2,312,339 and Rs. 44,04,012 during the year just ended, exhibiting an advance of maunds 1,734,222 or 300 per cent. in quantity and Rs. 21,59,980 or 96 per cent. in value. The increase was chiefly brought about by larger imports of —

16. Imports from Rajputana and Central India, when compared with the previous year, showed an improvement of maunds 299,559 or 150 per cent. and Rs. 23,29,004 or 102 per cent. They rose from maunds 199,377 and Rs. 22,78,327 in 1914-15 to maunds 498,936 and Rs. 46,07,331 during the year under comment. The following articles contributed to the rise:—

There was, however, a decline of maunds 19,268 under cotton, raw.

17. The import trade with the remaining blocks is too small to require special attention.

18. The causes of fluctuations in the principal items are given below:—

Coal and coke (+ 5,777,909 maunds or 212,249 tons). Owing to the scarcity of tonnage and high rates of freight all coal was imported by rail direct from the mines in Bengal and Bihar and Orissa.

Cotton raw (+ 42,713 maunds or 1,569 tons). The rise was due to a very large demand from Bombay owing to the relatively cheap price of Sind cotton as compared with Bengal.

Fodder, hay, straw and grass (+ 857,922 maunds or 31,515 tons). Local scarcity coupled with Commissariat requirements brought about the rise under this heading. Both the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh and the Punjab contributed to the rise.

Gram and Pulse (+ 1,080,500 maunds or 39,691 tons). The increase is due to a favourable crop both in Sind and the Punjab and heavy demand for exports to the United Kingdom.

Rice not in the husk (+128,405 maunds or 4,717 tons). Notwithstanding the smaller crops in Sind and the Punjab, very heavy shipments were made to Persian Gulf ports due to smaller exports from Bengal to those places on account of the scarcity of tonnage.

Wheat (-4,639,898 maunds or 170,445 tons). Exports were restricted owing to the embargo on all wheat exports except under Government control.

Grain and pulse, others (+5,352,902 maunds or 196,637 tons). The increase was due to high prices being offered in the United Kingdom for barley.

Hides of cattle, raw (+94,502 maunds or 3,471 tons). The increase under this heading is due to a very large demand from Italy for military purposes and from the United States of America, whose usual supplies from Continental markets were cut off owing to the war. Spain also was a large buyer.

Skins raw (+27,345 maunds or 1,004 tons). The increase is due to a brisk demand for goat and sheep skins from the United States of America where very good prices were paid.

Linseed (+146,376 maunds or 5,377 tons). The rise is due to a better crop in the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh.

Rapeseed (+1,132,688 maunds or 41,610). Better crops in the Punjab account for the rise.

Gunny bags (+118,809 maunds or 4,364 tons). The rise was brought about by heavy receipts from Bengal by rail instead of by sea on account of scarcity of steamer tonnage.

Ghi (+24,099 maunds or 885 tons). The increase was due to high prices prevailing in the market owing to large military requirements.

Silk raw (+4,531 maunds or 166 tons). There were large shipments of cocoons to Italy and France.

Wool, raw (+45,528 maunds or 1,672 tons). This commodity was in great demand for shipment to the United Kingdom.

EXPORTS.

19. The Export trade to the Punjab declined in quantity but rose in value, the figures for the last two years being maunds 9,451,971 and Rs. 10,20,99,703 in 1914-15 and maunds 6,110,951 and Rs. 10,65,44,737 showing a decrease of maunds 3,341,019 or 35 per cent. and an increase of Rs. 44,45,034 or 4 per cent. The decrease in quantity occurred chiefly under—

20. The exports to the United Provinces of Agra and Ondh showed a fall in quantity of maunds 68,411 or 14 percent. and an advance in value of Rs. 7,71,445 or 17 per cent. The figures of the last two years are maunds 498,028 and Rs. 45,93,422 and maunds 429,617 and Rs. 5,364,867 respectively. The articles that contributed to the deficit in quantity were—

21. Exports to the Presidency and the port of Bombay improved from maunds 184,176 and Rs. 15,11,251 in 1914-15 to maunds 227,820 and Rs. 16,75,108 during the year under notice, showing an increase of maunds 43,644 or 23 per cent. and Rs. 1,63,857 or 11 per cent. The increase was under—

22. The exports to Rajputana and Central India showed an increase of maunds 526,763 in quantity and Rs. 13,94,564 in value, having risen from maunds 417,583 and Rs. 39,13,732 in 1914-15 to maunds 944,346 and Rs. 53,08,296. The increase is chiefly noticeable under:—

23. The export trade with other blocks is too insignificant to be mentioned.

24. The principal variations in the export trade are explained below:—

Coal and coke (—1,677,383 maunds or 61,618 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 18.

Cotton piece-goods, foreign (+33,550 maunds or 1,232 tons). Large purchases were made during the latter portion of the year 1914-15, dealers anticipating a rise in price inspite of heavy stocks in hand. There were also imports of cheap Japanese goods. All these circumstances combined to raise the exports.

Cotton piece-goods, Indian (+25,670 maunds or 943 tons). There was a good demand from upcountry. Compared with English goods, Indian were for part of the year distinctly cheap. Prices, however, latterly rose considerably in sympathy with the rise in cotton.

Jawar and bajra (+265,258 maunds or 9,744 tons). The rise was due to heavy exports to Rajputana and Central India where there was scarcity of foodstuffs owing to the failure of monsoon.

Dried fruits and nuts (+47,080 maunds or 1,729 tons). The rise was due to larger imports of wet dates from Busreh from the stocks accumulated after the declaration of war by Turkey which were released on the British occupation of the place.

Iron and steel, wrought (Bars, sheets, etc.) (—655,345 maunds or 24,074 tons). The decrease is attributable to the small imports of this commodity from European countries owing to high prices at supplying centres, freight difficulties and the engagement of manufacturers on Government work.

Kerosene oil (—152,902 maunds or 5,617 tons). The balance from large receipts of liquid fuel from Persia in the previous year was sufficient for the needs of the North-Western Railway, hence the decrease.

Sugar, refined (+537,448 maunds or 19,743 tons). The increase follows on a very large decline in the previous year and that inspite of a considerable rise in prices as will be seen from the following table:—

Cotton, raw (—195,434 maunds or 7,179 tons). The low inundation and the fall in prices in 1914-15 restricted cultivation and the outturn was consequently smaller.

Jawar and bajra (+101,609 maunds or 3,732 tons). The increase was due to large quantities being required for despatch coastwise to Cutch Kathiawar ports where there was a scarcity of foodstuffs owing to the failure of the monsoons.

Rice not in the husk (+554,410 maunds or 20,366 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 18.

Cotton seed (—221,770 maunds or 8,147 tons). The decrease was due to a small cotton crop and a local demand for fodder purposes.

Exports from Karachi.

Coal and Coke (—2,590,700 maunds or 95,168 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 18.

Cotton piece-goods, foreign (+19,209 maunds or 706 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 24.

Iron and steel, wrought (Bars, sheets, etc.) (—101,809 maunds or 3,739 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 24.

Dried fruits and nuts (+104,453 maunds or 3,837 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 24.

Sugar unrefined, gur, rab and jagri (—29,041 maunds or 1,067 tons). The Punjab took a larger quantity than in the previous year and less was therefore available for despatch to the internal block.

Sugar refined (+10,017 maunds or 368 tons). *Vide* remarks in paragraph 24.

III.—OTHER IMPORTANT FEATURES OF THE TRADE.

26. The trade of the Port of Karachi during 1915-16 was, as usual, larger than that of the rest of Sind.

27. A statement showing the trade of the Punjab with Sind and British Baluchistan by the River Indus for the year 1915-16 is attached. The total imports from the Punjab by river amounted to maunds 1,672,410 and exhibited a decrease of maunds 12,310 compared with the previous year's figures which were maunds 1,684,720; and the total quantity which took the rail at Sukkur and Kotri was maunds 606,830 against maunds 837,562. The total quantity exported to the Punjab by river was maunds 216,700 during the year under review, of which maunds 121,716 were exported from Karachi and the rest *viz.*, maunds 94,984 from Sind and British Baluchistan, against maunds 244,330 during the year 1914-15, of which Karachi had contributed maunds 135,717 and Sind and British Baluchistan maunds 108,613.

A statement showing the value rates adopted for each article for each quarter is attached as Appendix A.

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 17 blocks, *viz.*, nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4) Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; four representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana and Central India, (2) Kashmir, (3) the Nizam's Territory and (4) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi, and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British Province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods, for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office for compilation, by the Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikanir Railway, Jodhpur.

The figures of the Export trade are furnished by—

- (1) The Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore.
- (2) The Government Examiner of Accounts, Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway, Bombay.
- (3) The Examiner of Accounts, Oudh and Rohilkhand Railway, Lucknow.
- (4) The Examiner of Accounts, Eastern Bengal State Railway, Calcutta.
- (5) The Chief Auditor, East Indian Railway, Calcutta.
- (6) The Chief Auditor, Bengal and North-Western Railway, Gorakpur.
- (7) The Auditor, Bengal-Nagpur Railway, Calcutta.
- (8) The Chief Auditor, Great Indian Peninsula Railway, Bombay, (Indian Midland Railway Section)..
- (9) The Auditor of Bengal Provincial Railway Company, Limited, Magra.
- (10) The Auditor of Accounts, Rohilkhand and Kumaon Railway, Bareilly.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River.

Indus, Sukkur. The river traffic is adjusted in the return according to the following rules laid down in Government of India letter No. 518/57-3 Statistics, dated the 5th June 1890 :—

- I. When the imports by river from the Punjab exceed the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi, the latter is classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference as imports from the Punjab into Sind and British Baluchistan.
- II. When the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi exceed the imports by river from the Punjab, the latter is classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference plus the imports from other stations in Sind and British Baluchistan to Karachi as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- III. When the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri exceed the exports by river to the Punjab, the latter is classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab, and the difference plus the exports from Karachi to Sind (excluding Sukkur and Kotri) as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- IV. When the exports by river to the Punjab exceed the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri, the latter is classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab and the difference as exports from Sind and British Baluchistan to the Punjab.

The quarterly returns received from the several registering officers are compiled in this office and a consolidated return showing quantities, but no values, is sent every quarter to the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta.

The registering officers give only the weight of the goods in maunds of 82½ lbs. Lists of value rates are supplied by each province quarterly and the values of the trade of each quarter are worked out separately in this office and then added together for the annual returns. The Native States furnish no returns, the trade registered is the trade which comes into and goes out of each block by rail; and the value rates of Sind are adopted in calculating the value of the trade.

Appendix A shows the value rates for Sind and British Baluchistan adopted in each of the four quarters of the year 1915-16 at which the values of the articles in which the trade was carried on are calculated.

(a) The rates of articles marked A (in the appendix), which represent the value rates of foreign merchandise are based on the values declared by the importers in their bills-of-entry at the time of passing the goods out of the Custom House, and may therefore be regarded as approximately accurate.

(b) The rates for articles marked B, which represent articles of Indian merchandise, are supplied by the Director of Agriculture, Bombay, who obtains them from the monthly returns furnished to him by the Muzar Deputy Collectors of Karachi, Hyderabad and Sukkur, which are published by him in the Gazette. They represent the average of the monthly prices ruling on the 20th of each month and may be regarded as reliable.

(c) The rates of articles marked C in the appendix are obtained by the Director of Agriculture by local inquiry from wholesale dealers in Bombay. In respect of railway plant, inquiry is made of the B. B. and C. I. and G. I. P. Railway workshops, and in respect of twist and yarn and piece-goods (Indian), the rates are worked out from quotations furnished by the Mill-owners' Association to the Chamber of Commerce. These rates may be regarded as approximately correct.

(d) The rates of articles marked D are the rates fixed once for all in consultation with the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta, and are therefore merely conventional.

(e) The rates of articles marked E, which represent Indian liquors, are supplied by the Abkari Inspector, Karachi.

Table I shows the rail and river-borne trade of the blocks—(1) Karachi and (2) Sind and British Baluchistan with each other as well as with each of the other blocks into which India is divided. In this table the trade of any Province under any head which does not exceed Rs. 10,000 in value against either imports or exports has been lumped up and shown against "Other places," the Province to which such trade appertains not being specifically shown. A statement showing the river-borne trade separately is also appended and marked I-A.

Table II shows the traffic between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi. The whole of this trade is carried by rail, as there is no direct communication with Karachi by river.

The articles shown in the above tables are arranged in alphabetical order. The classification corresponds in the main with that employed in the sea-borne trade accounts, but is less detailed.

REPORT ON THE RAIL AND RIVER-BORNE TRADE OF THE PROVINCE OF SIND AND BRITISH BALUCHISTAN FOR THE YEAR 1917-18.

1. There were no changes in the classification of the articles entering into the Rail and River-borne trade of India during the year 1917-18. The arrangement of the blocks and the system of registration also remained unchanged.

GENERAL REMARKS.

2. The 1917 inundation was unusually late, and on the whole unsatisfactory in Sind. It was, however, abnormally protracted and produced a better agricultural yield than was at first anticipated. Inundations caused by exceptionally heavy rains in August and September, when the river was already high, damaged the kharif crops in many places. Rabi growings were much above the average owing to large areas having come under floods.

The most important irrigational work carried out during 1917-18 was the thorough clearance of the first 13 miles of the Jamrao canal after it had been worked for a period of 17 years.

In the Punjab the rabi crops of 1916-17 suffered as in the previous year on account of the failure of the winter rains and the consequent low inundation. The rainfall in 1917 was, however, exceptionally heavy and well distributed; but unseasonable rain in October damaged the kharif crops to a great extent.

8. The total of this trade, both External and Internal, in 1917-18 amounted to 115,560,693 maunds valued at Rs. 59-11 crores, an increase of 39,451,061 maunds or 51 per cent. in quantity and of Rs. 12-66 crores or 27 per cent. in value as compared with 1916-17. The figures are the highest yet recorded.

The striking increase in imports in 1917-18 was due to heavy arrivals of Coal and Coke, Hay, Straw and Grass, Gram and Pulse, Wheat, Grain and Pulse, Others, Railway Plant and Rolling Stock, Sugar, refined, and Wool, raw. Decreases occurred under Cotton, raw, Hides and Skins, Raw, Jute, *viz.*, Gunny bags and cloth, Oilseeds, *viz.*, Linseed and Rape and Mustard.

Exports from Karachi declined considerably year by year since the outbreak of war, and the quantity exported in 1917-18, *viz.*, 6,429,024 maunds was less than one-third of the exports in 1913-14. The decline is again attributable mainly to the cessation of exports of Coal and Coke for railway purposes. The total exports as compared with 1916-17 fell by 763,260 maunds or 10 per cent. owing chiefly to smaller exports of Cotton Piece-goods, Metals, Dried fruits and Nuts, and Sugar, refined.

9. Imports from the External blocks in 1917-18 were 93,930,545 maunds valued at over Rs. 32 crores, an increase of 37,639,999 maunds or 66 per cent. in quantity and of Rs. 9-06 crores or 39 per cent. in value as compared with the figures for 1916-17.

10. Exports to the External blocks, which amounted to 5,296,830 maunds valued at Rs. 8-77 crores in 1917-18, were less than in the previous year by 807,085 maunds or 13 per cent. in quantity and by Rs. 1-35 crores or 13 per cent. in value.

11. The total internal or local trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan in 1917-18 amounted to 16,333,318 maunds valued at Rs. 18.32 crores against 13,715,171 maunds valued at Rs. 13.36 crores in 1916-17, an expansion of 19 per cent. in quantity and 36 per cent. in value.

Imports into Karachi from Sind and British Baluchistan rose during 1917-18 to 13,042,259 maunds valued at Rs. 11.81 crores, an increase of 2,509,523 maunds or 23 per cent. in quantity and of Rs. 4.24 crores or 55 per cent. in value. Compared with the year 1913-14, the figures show an increase of 11 per cent. in quantity and of 74 per cent. in value. The articles which contributed to the increase were, Cotton, raw, Gram and Pulse, Rice not in the husk, Wheat, Wheat flour, Grain and Pulse, Others, Metallic ores, Ghee, Railway carriages and trucks and parts thereof, and Wool, raw.

Exports from Karachi to Sind and British Baluchistan were 3,291,059 maunds valued at Rs. 6.42 crores in 1917-18, an increase of 108,624 maunds or 3 per cent. in quantity and of Rs. 71.35 lakhs or 12 per cent. in value over the exports of 1916-17, which is due mainly to larger exports of Cotton piece-goods, Indian.

The causes of the fluctuations in the principal commodities are explained in paragraphs 18, 24 and 25.

I.—EXTERNAL TRADE.

Imports.

12. The total imports from the Punjab in 1917-18 amounted to 44,831,365 maunds valued at Rs. 20.69 crores and exceeded the figures of 1916-17 by 10,975,665 maunds or 32 per cent. in quantity and by Rs. 3.23 crores or 18 per cent. in value. The increase is attributable to larger imports of Hay, Straw and Grass (+3 lakhs maunds), Gram and Pulse (+47½ lakhs maunds), Wheat (+35½ lakhs maunds), Wheat flour (+6½ lakhs maunds), Grain and Pulse, Others (+18 lakhs maunds), Railway materials, Others (+9½ lakhs maunds) and Timber, excluding railway sleepers (+7½ lakhs maunds). Decreases occurred under Cotton, raw (-6 lakhs maunds), and Oilseeds, *viz.*, Rape and Mustard (-14 lakhs maunds).

13. The total import trade with the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh in 1917-18 was 16,658,300 maunds valued at Rs. 5.90 crores, an advance of 10,021,668 maunds or 150 per cent. in quantity and of Rs. 3.20 crores or 118 per cent. in value on the figures of 1916-17. Heavy receipts of Hay, Straw and Grass (+12½ lakhs maunds), Gram and Pulse (+19½ lakhs maunds), Wheat (+40½ lakhs maunds) and Grain and Pulse, Others (+34 lakhs maunds) explain the increase. Oil-seeds, *viz.*, Rape and Mustard, decreased by 5½ lakhs of maunds.

14. The total imports from the Bombay Presidency including the port of Bombay during 1917-18 were 506,854 maunds valued at Rs. 68.17 lakhs and exceeded the figures of 1916-17 by 198,940 maunds or 64 per cent. in quantity and by Rs. 22.61 lakhs or 49 per cent. in value. The rise was chiefly owing to larger exports of Grain and Pulse, Others.

15. The total imports from Bengal including the port of Calcutta were 2,316,326 maunds valued at Rs. 1.74 crores in 1917-18, a decrease, as compared with 1916-17, of 908,390 maunds or 28 per cent. in quantity and an increase of Rs. 85½ lakhs or 96 per cent. in value. The decrease in quantity was mainly owing to smaller imports of Coal and Coke, and the increase in value was due to the general rise in the price of all articles of merchandise. A feature of the trade with Bengal in 1917-18 was that Calcutta for the first time sent a large quantity (2½ lakhs of maunds) of refined sugar to Karachi by rail.

16. The total imports from Rajputana and Central India in 1917-18 amounted to 2,349,862 maunds valued at Rs. 1.14 crores and exceeded the total imports of the previous year by 1,781,854 maunds or 313 per cent. in quantity and by Rs. 64½ lakhs or 128 per cent. in value. Gram and Pulse (+7½ lakhs maunds), Wheat (+3 lakhs maunds) and Grain and Pulse, Others (+7½ lakhs maunds) contributed to the increase.

17. The import trade with other blocks was insignificant and needs no comment.

18. The increases and decreases in quantity which occurred in 1917-18 in the principal articles are explained below:—

Coal and Coke (+13,357,328 maunds).—As in the previous year, there were no imports by sea of coal, and large quantities were therefore imported by rail from the mines in Bengal and Bihar and Orissa.

Cotton, raw (—611,250 maunds).—The decrease was due to smaller imports from the Punjab which sent only 95,788 maunds against over 7 lakhs maunds in 1916-17. Damage to the crops by abnormally heavy rains and floods caused the decline.

Fodder, Hay, Straw and Grass (+1,473,307 maunds).—The increase was owing to larger importations from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh and the Punjab for military requirements.

Gram and Pulse (+7,564,458 maunds).—The increase is attributable to heavy imports from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, the Punjab and Rajputana and Central India for shipment on Government account.

Wheat (+7,863,233 maunds).—Of the total increase of over 78 lakhs maunds, the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh contributed over 40 lakhs maunds and the Punjab over 35 lakhs maunds. The outturn of the crops in both these provinces in 1916-17 was better than in the preceding year, and larger quantities were, therefore, available for shipment.

Grain and Pulse, Others (+7,026,097 maunds).—The increase was caused by heavy imports for Government purposes from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, the Punjab, Bihar and Orissa, and Rajputana and Central India.

Hides, raw (—147,811 maunds).—Smaller imports from the Punjab owing to the restrictions on export by sea accounted for the decrease.

Linseed (—102,548 maunds).—The decrease was due to smaller imports from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh and the Punjab in consequence of a smaller demand from the United Kingdom and France.

Rape and Mustard Seed (—1,988,665 maunds).—The Punjab yield was normal and that of the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh was 25 per cent. below the normal. Imports from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh fell by 5½ lakhs maunds and those from the Punjab by 14 lakhs maunds owing to a poor demand from the United Kingdom which imported over a million cwts. less than in 1916-17.

Sugar, refined (+272,289 maunds).—The increase was solely owing to large imports of Java sugar from Calcutta. Freight from Java was readily available to Calcutta and the prices at that port were comparatively so low that Karachi dealers found it profitable to obtain sugar overland from there.

Wool, raw (+157,773 maunds).—The increase was due mainly to larger receipts from the Punjab in anticipation of a good demand for export by sea. These exports were, however, less than in the previous year owing to want of steamer tonnage.

Exports.

19. The total exports to the Punjab fell from 5,027,441 maunds valued at Rs. 8.93 crores in 1916-17 to 3,872,550 maunds valued at Rs. 7.37 crores in 1917-18, a decrease of 22 per cent. in quantity and 17 per cent. in value. The fall occurred mainly in Cotton piece-goods, Indian and Foreign (—1½ lakhs maunds), Marble and Stone (—2½ lakhs maunds), Kerosine oil (—1½ lakhs maunds), and Sugar, refined (—4½ lakhs maunds). Exports of Cotton seed increased by 2½ lakhs maunds.

20. The total exports to the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh amounting to 388,475 maunds valued at Rs. 41 lakhs, rose as compared with those for 1916-17 by 119,297 maunds or 44 per cent. in quantity, but fell by Rs. 3.61 lakhs or 8 per cent. in value. The export of salt amounting to 169,043 maunds in 1917-18 against only 53 maunds in 1916-17 explains the quantitative increase, while reduced exports of comparatively high-priced articles account for the fall in value.

21. Exports to the Bombay Presidency including the port of Bombay were 513,453 maunds valued at Rs. 40.48 lakhs in 1917-18, and exceeded the exports of the previous year by 238,284 maunds or 86 per cent. in quantity and by Rs. 21.48 lakhs or 113 per cent. in value. Larger despatches of Jowari and Bajri (+2½ lakhs maunds) caused the increase.

22. The total exports to Rajputana and Central India declined from 418,123 maunds valued at Rs. 38.38 lakhs in 1916-17 to 336,540 maunds valued at Rs. 34.69 lakhs in 1917-18. The fall of 19 per cent. in quantity and 9 per cent. in value occurred chiefly under Hay, Straw and Grass (—13,464 maunds) and Jowari and Bajri (—65,775 maunds).

23. Exports to other blocks were negligible.

24. The variations in the quantities of the principal articles of exports are explained below :—

Cotton piece-goods, Foreign (—69,953 maunds).—Abnormally high prices ruling throughout the year restricted exports.

Cotton piece-goods, Indian (—78,084 maunds).—The decrease is partly due to the high prices prevailing and partly to reduced imports by sea from Bombay.

Jowari and Bajri (+141,588 maunds).—The increase is attributable mainly to larger exports to the Bombay Presidency excluding Bombay port, which took over 2½ lakhs maunds against 8,287 maunds in 1916-17.

Kerosine oil (—167,783 maunds).—Reduced imports by sea from foreign countries as well as from Burma owing to the scarcity of tankers caused the decrease in exports by rail from the port.

Sugar, refined (—508,246 maunds).—The decrease occurred solely in exports to the Punjab in consequence of smaller imports by sea from Java owing to scarcity of tonnage.

II.—INTERNAL BLOCKS.

25. The fluctuations in the quantities of the principal articles are explained below :—

Imports into Karachi.

Cotton, raw (35,372 maunds).—Although the area under cultivation in Sind during 1917-18 was 244,695 acres or nearly 2 per cent. more than in 1916-17, the outturn fell from 77,870 bales of 400 lbs. each to 48,078 bales or by 38 per cent. owing to the crops having been damaged by excessive rains and late inundation. The crop was reported to be one-third of the normal in Nawabshah and Thar and Parkar and about half of the normal elsewhere. Exports by sea to foreign countries were the lowest on record. Bombay, however, took 1½ lakhs cwts. more than in 1916-17. Abnormally high prices obtainable in the local market induced larger imports by rail.

Jowari and Bajri (—115,000 maunds).—Imports fell owing to a poor demand for exports by sea to foreign countries.

Rice not in the husk (+118,571 maunds).—Although the 1917-18 crop was not favourable the large demand for exports by sea was met to a great extent from the crop of the previous year.

Wheat (+753,675 maunds).—The Sind crop was reported to be half of the normal in Thar and Parkar and between 67 and 90 per cent. of the normal elsewhere. Larger imports were, however, made to meet heavy shipments on Government account.

Cotton seed (+100,467 maunds).—The increase was due to a large demand from Kathiawar which took 215,035 cwts. in 1917-18 against only 95,212 cwts. in 1916-17.

Wool, raw (+207,144 maunds).—Heavy imports were made in anticipation of larger requirements for exports by sea to foreign countries. Scarcity of freight, however, operated against exports by sea which were less than in the previous year.

Exports from Karachi.

Cotton piece-goods, Foreign (—45,917 maunds).—*Vide* remarks in paragraph 24 above.

Iron and Steel, Wrought, Bars, Sheets, Girders and other commercial forms of iron and steel (—53,470 maunds).—The decrease under this head is explained by smaller imports by sea owing to abnormally high prices and to the restrictions imposed on exports from the United Kingdom.

Kerosine oil (+190,017 maunds).—The increase was due to larger requirements in Sind.

Dried fruits and Nuts (—119,177 maunds).—The decrease is ascribed to a smaller demand owing to high prices.

Sugar, unrefined, Gur, Rab, Jaggery, Molasses and other crude saccharine produce (—78,395 maunds).—The decrease in exports under this head was due to the cessation of imports of molasses from Java during 1917-18.

III.—OTHER IMPORTANT FEATURES OF THE TRADE.

26. The trade of the port of Karachi during 1917-18 was, as usual, larger than that of the rest of Sind.

27. The appended Statement I-A* shows the trade between the Punjab and Sind and British Baluchistan by the River Indus during the year 1917-18. The total imports from the Punjab were 1,763,678 maunds in 1917-18, an increase of 53,498 maunds over the figures of 1916-17. The total quantity of this trade which took the rail at Sukkur and Kotri was 561,073 maunds against 584,717 maunds. Exports to the Punjab by river fell by 17,400 maunds to 247,360 maunds in 1917-18 of which Karachi sent 112,085 maunds and Sind and British Baluchistan 135,275 maunds against 125,281 maunds and 139,479 maunds, respectively, in the preceding year.

A statement showing the value rates adopted for each article for each quarter is attached as Appendix A.

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 17 blocks, *viz.*, nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4) Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; four representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana and Central India, (2) Kashmir, (3) the Nizam's Territory and (4) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British Province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods, for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office for compilation, by the Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway, Jodhpur.

- (8) The Chief Auditor, Great Indian Peninsula Railway, Bombay (Indian Midland Railway Section).
- (9) The Auditor of Bengal Provincial Railway Company, Limited, Magera.
- (10) The Auditor of Accounts, Rohilkhand and Kumaon Railway, Bareilly.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 17 blocks, viz., nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4) Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; four representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana and Central India, (2) Kashmir, (3) the Nizam's Territory and (4) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British Province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods, for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office for compilation, by the Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway, Jodhpur.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River

Railway workshops, and in respect of twist and yarn and piece-goods (Indian), the rates are worked out from quotations furnished by the Mill-owners' Association to the Chamber of Commerce. These rates may be regarded as approximately correct.

(e) The rates of articles marked E, which represent Indian liquors, are supplied by the Abkari Inspector, Karachi.

Table I shows the rail and river-borne trade of the blocks—(1) Karachi and (2) Sind and British Baluchistan with each other as well as with each of the other blocks into which India is divided. In this table the trade of any Province under any head which does not exceed Rs. 10,000 in value against either imports or exports has been lumped up and shown against "Other places," the Province to which such trade appertains not being specifically shown. A statement showing the river-borne trade separately is also appended and marked I-A.

Table II shows the traffic between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi. The whole of this trade is carried by rail, as there is no direct communication with Karachi by river.

The articles shown in the above tables are arranged in alphabetical order. The classification corresponds in the main with that employed in the sea-borne trade accounts, but is less detailed.

REPORT ON THE RAIL AND RIVER-BORNE TRADE OF THE PROVINCE OF SIND AND BRITISH BALUCHISTAN FOR THE YEAR 1918-19.

1. The classification of the articles specified in this issue of the Report and the division into blocks and system of registration have not been changed during the year under review.

GENERAL REMARKS.

2. The inundation of the River Indus in 1918 was among the lowest on record; rainfall was negligible throughout Sind, and the area under both kharif and rabi crops was in consequence much below the average. The average yield was moreover very poor.

Similar conditions obtained in the Punjab where the irrigated area was one-third less than in the previous year. The pandemic outbreaks of influenza in the summer and autumn of 1918 also tended to diminish the outturn of food-grains and oilseeds which in normal years bulk so largely in the rail and river-borne trade of Sind. Restrictions on exports, lack of tonnage, and the diversion of the reduced Punjab supplies of food-grains to more needy parts of India have also served to reduce the traffic over the North-Western Railway. Heavy military movements, however, continued throughout the year, and set off to some extent the reduction in private trade, and the general rise in the level of prices was such as to render the gross value of the rail-borne trade of Sind, Baluchistan and Karachi, greater than in any previous year.

3. Traffic on the River Indus showed an increase both in quantities and values despite the unfavourable season. The determining cause was the restriction of the booking of private merchandise by rail. In particular, the strict limitation of exports by rail of wheat and gram from the Punjab to Sind and Karachi, in pursuance of the food control, led to the shipment of large quantities of these grains by the River Indus.

4. Railway Extensions, &c.—The doubling of the Shahdadpur-Begmanji section was in progress during the year. Apart from this there was no addition to the railway mileage within the trade blocks.

5. The following statement of average prices has been supplied by the Director of Agriculture, Bombay :—

8. In the year under review a considerable falling-off will be observed on the import side. Even in the first half of the year the failure of the rains and the consequent hardening of prices had a depressing effect on the trade in food-grains, and lack of ocean tonnage and restrictions on export, coupled at a later date with the control of inter-provincial movements of food-grains, reduced this important branch of trade almost to negligible proportions. As already

pointed out, there was a heavy decrease in the output of oilseeds in the producing areas served by Karachi port. None the less there was an increase, due to heavy railments in the latter part of the year, in arrivals of seeds at the port. This is in the main accounted for by the gradual relaxation after the armistice of the strict control exercised by the Ministry of Shipping over the cargoes carried by British Liners. In particular there was a welcome revival of the export trade in cotton-seed. Imports of wool decreased materially. In the previous year, roughly, equal quantities were brought in from the Punjab and from or *via* Baluchistan. The Punjab wool exhibited the greatest falling off, and here again it is probable that lack of tonnage was the determining factor. Imports of hides and skins, for which tonnage was more freely provided, again increased. Shipments to Mesopotamia accounted for increased arrivals of fodder in the earlier part of the year. With the cessation of hostilities and the failure of the rains these imports were much reduced in the last two quarters. Though the imports of raw cotton were slightly more than in 1917-18 the increase was entirely accounted for by bigger arrivals of Sind cotton. The trade in Punjab cotton, of which roughly 75,000 tons were brought into Karachi in 1913-14, has almost vanished, the Punjab supplies now going almost in their entirety to Bombay.

9. Though still in point of quantity much below the prewar level, exports by rail from Karachi exhibited an appreciable increase. Before the war movements of sea-borne coal served greatly to swell the export figures. This factor has now become almost negligible, and the conversion of locomotives on the North-Western Railway to the use of oilfuel will probably prevent coal from again assuming the important place it once held in the rail-borne export figures. In the latter part of the year after the cessation of hostilities the large military stocks of bran and crushed food, accumulated in Karachi for shipment to Mesopotamia, became available to relieve the shortage of civil supplies of cattle food, and there were consequently large exports of these forms of fodder from Karachi to Sind and the Punjab. Exports of wrought iron and steel on the other hand decreased in volume by about 36 per cent. Exports of foreign piece-goods increased somewhat in quantity, but there was a heavy fall in the railments of Indian piece-goods to both the chief markets, Sind and the Punjab.

10. The rail-borne trade of Sind (excluding Karachi) and Baluchistan is to a large extent reflected in the figures for the port of Karachi itself. The surplus produce of the area is for the most part railed to Karachi for export, and the requirements of the area from outside are, with the exception of coal and certain food-grains, mainly drawn through Karachi. The striking feature of the trade apart from the points already mentioned in connection with the trade of the port, was the largely increased import of sugar into the mofussil districts from Calcutta. Comparatively low prices ruled in Calcutta for a good part of the year, and stocks were very heavy there while freight for sugar direct from Java or Mauritius to Karachi was only obtainable with great difficulty.

11. The appended Statement 1-A shows the trade between the Punjab and Sind and British Baluchistan by the River Indus during the year 1918-19. The total imports from the Punjab rose from 1,763,678 maunds to 2,372,709 maunds in 1918-19 or by 34 per cent. The total quantity of this trade, which took the rail at Sukkur and Kotri, was 364,817 maunds against 561,073 maunds last year. Exports to the Punjab by river advanced from 247,360 maunds to 302,700 maunds in 1918-19 of which Karachi sent 149,157 maunds and Sind and British Baluchistan 153,543 maunds against 112,085 maunds and 135,275 maunds, respectively, in 1917-18.

Chief Collector of Customs in Sind.

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 17 blocks, *viz.*, nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4) Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; four representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana and Central India, (2) Kashmir, (3) the Nizam's Territory and (4) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods, for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the Import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office, for compilation, by the Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway, Jodhpur.

The figures of the Export trade are furnished by—

- (1) The Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore.
- (2) The Government Examiner of Accounts, Bombay, Baroda & Central India Railway, Bombay.
- (3) The Examiner of Accounts, Oudh & Rohilkhand Railway, Lucknow.
- (4) The Examiner of Accounts, Eastern Bengal State Railway, Calcutta.
- (5) The Chief Auditor, East Indian Railway, Calcutta.
- (6) The Chief Auditor, Bengal & North-Western Railway, Gorakhpur.
- (7) The Auditor, Bengal-Nagpur Railway, Calcutta.
- (8) The Chief Auditor, Great Indian Peninsula Railway, Bombay (Indian Midland Railway Section).
- (9) The Auditor of Bengal Provincial Railway Company, Limited, Magera.
- (10) The Auditor of Accounts, Rohilkhand & Kumaon Railway, Bareilly.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River

Indus, Sukkur. The river traffic is adjusted in the return according to the following rules laid down in Government of India letter No. 518/57-3-Statistics, dated the 5th June 1890 :—

- I.—When the imports by river from the Punjab exceed the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference as imports from the Punjab into Sind and British Baluchistan.
- II.—When the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi exceed the imports by river from the Punjab, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference plus the imports from other stations in Sind and British Baluchistan to Karachi as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- III.—When the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri exceed the exports by river to the Punjab, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab, and the difference plus the exports from Karachi to Sind (excluding Sukkur and Kotri) as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- IV.—When the exports by river to the Punjab exceed the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab and the difference as exports from Sind and British Baluchistan to the Punjab.

The quarterly returns received from the several registering officers are compiled in this office and a consolidated return showing quantities, but no values, is sent every quarter to the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta.

The registering officers give only the weight of the goods in maunds of 82½ lbs. Lists of value rates are supplied by each province quarterly and the values of the trade of each quarter are worked out separately in this office and then added together for the annual returns. The Native States furnish no returns, the trade registered is the trade which comes into and goes out of each block by rail; and the value rates of Sind are adopted in calculating the value of the trade.

Appendix A shows the value rates for Sind and British Baluchistan adopted in each of the four quarters of the year 1918-19 at which the values of the articles in which the trade was carried on are calculated.

(a) The rates of articles marked A (in the appendix), which represent the value rates of foreign merchandise, are based on the values declared by the importers in their bills-of-entry at the time of passing the goods out of the Custom House, and may therefore be regarded as approximately accurate.

(b) The rates for articles marked B, which represent articles of Indian merchandise, are supplied by the Director of Agriculture, Bombay, who obtains them from the monthly returns furnished to him by the Huzur Deputy Collectors of Karachi, Hyderabad and Sukkur, which are published by him in the Gazette. They represent the average of the monthly prices ruling on the 20th of each month and may be regarded as reliable.

(c) The rates of articles marked O are the rates fixed once for all in consultation with the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta, and are therefore merely conventional.

(d) The rates of articles marked D in the appendix are obtained by the Director of Agriculture by local inquiry from wholesale dealers in Bombay. In

respect of railway plant, inquiry is made of the B. B. C. I. & G. I. P. Railway workshops, and in respect of twist and yarn and piece-goods (Indian), the rates are worked out from quotations furnished by the Millowners' Association to the Chamber of Commerce. These rates may be regarded as approximately correct.

(e) The rates of articles marked E, which represent Indian liquors, are supplied by the Abkari Inspector, Karachi.

Table I shows the rail and river-borne trade of the blocks—(1) Karachi and (2) Sind and British Baluchistan with each other as well as with each of the other blocks into which India is divided. In this table the trade of any province under any head which does not exceed Rs. 10,000 in value against either imports or exports has been lumped up and shown against "Other places," the province to which such trade appertains not being specifically shown. A statement showing the river-borne trade separately is also appended and marked I-A.

Table II shows the traffic between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi. The whole of this trade is carried by rail, as there is no direct communication with Karachi by river.

The articles shown in the above tables are arranged in alphabetical order. The classification corresponds in the main with that employed in the sea-borne trade accounts, but is less detailed.

Report on the Rail and River-borne Trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan for the year 1919-20.

1. The system under which the rail and river-borne trade is registered and classified is explained in a note appended to this report. The only changes to which effect was given during the year under review were the opening of a new heading, *viz.*, "Bones" in the classified list of articles of trade, and the division, owing to a considerable development of trade, of the trade block "Rajputana and Central India" into two separate external trade blocks, *viz.*, (1) Rajputana and (2) Central India. Both these changes were introduced with effect from 1st April 1919, the opening of the official year.

GENERAL REMARKS.

2. The inundation of the river Indus in 1918 was practically a complete failure, and the effects of this are still visible in the trade figures of the year under report. Fortunately the inundation in 1919, was satisfactory, and the areas under cultivation showed a considerable expansion in consequence. The rainfall, however, was irregular. In some places it was moderate and beneficial to the crops, while in others it was excessive and caused damage, especially on the Jamrao Canal, where it reduced the yield of the cotton crop. In the Punjab, the conditions in both the kharif and rabi seasons were favourable for the maturing of the crops, as rainfall was timely and copious and irrigation good. Despite these favourable conditions, traffic on the North-Western Railway showed a considerable falling off, the reason being that as the export of food-grains from India was throughout the year prohibited, stocks were not railed freely into Karachi.

3. Though traffic on the river Indus exhibited a slight decrease as compared with the previous year, yet the figures are still higher than in 1917-18. Imports of food-grains and timber from the Punjab into Sind formed the chief items of the river trade.

4. Railway extensions, &c.—The doubling of the lines from Golra to Rawalpindi, Shahdadpur to Nawabshah and Kot Laloo to Khariro was completed, and the lines were opened for traffic, while the construction of the new lines, *viz.*, (1) Larkana-Dodapur section of the Larkana-Jacobabad Railway and (2) the Nushki Extension Railway, was under progress during the year.

8. It will be noticed that imports into Karachi during the year 1919-20 were the lowest recorded during the decade, the decrease in volume as compared with the previous year being 53 per cent. The almost complete embargo on the export of all food-grains to foreign countries, which was imposed by Government in order to relieve the acute situation in India, was the cause of this serious contraction of rail-borne imports. *Wheat* arrivals, which form nearly half the bulk of this traffic in a normal year, were reduced to negligible quantities. As in the war years, *coal and coke* for both railway and other purposes continued to arrive solely by rail, mostly from Bihar and Orissa, owing to the scarcity of tonnage in the coasting

trade, but the figures, especially of *coal for other purposes*, exhibit a marked decline, which appears to be due to the decreased demands of the Admiralty. Imports of *raw cotton* show a considerable expansion, a noteworthy feature being that the Punjab, which has latterly been sending its cotton almost entirely to Bombay, again favoured Karachi by sending some 1,218,970 maunds of this commodity as against 26,000 maunds last year. This diversion was due to the fact that railway difficulties prevented bookings from the Punjab direct to Bombay, and consequently considerable exports were made to Bombay *via* Karachi. Large shipments were also effected to foreign countries direct from Karachi during the year, in contrast to the happenings of the previous two years when such direct trade was insignificant. *Fodder*, which arrived in large quantities during the war years for military requirements, fell away noticeably. Imports of *raw hides and skins* were very heavy, especially from the Punjab, owing to a brisk demand for exports by sea to foreign countries. Arrivals of *oilseeds* again showed a considerable advance. Some 1,415,088 maunds of *cottonseed* were imported from the Punjab, as against only 5,034 maunds in the preceding year, to meet a keen demand from the United Kingdom, consequent on the release of the trade from war restrictions. Imports of *rape and mustard seed* also rose by 44 per cent. in quantity owing to a large demand from Europe. The quantity of *raw wool* imported by rail showed a substantial increase, to which the Punjab was the chief contributor.

9. Although there was a further increase in the quantities of rail-borne exports from Karachi during the year 1919-20, yet the figures were only half the pre-war average. This decline, as explained last year, was chiefly determined by the entire absence of exports of sea-borne *coal*, which before the war always swelled the export figures. Exports of *foreign piece-goods* exhibited a decline, but those of *Indian piece-goods* increased considerably. Both, Sind and British Baluchistan and the Punjab drew heavily. Railments of *kerosene* showed a large expansion, the Punjab taking most of this oil. Despatches of *refined sugar* were reduced to less than half of those of the previous year, high prices being the sole cause of the decreased consumption.

10. The rail-borne trade of Sind (excluding Karachi) and British Baluchistan does not need much separate comment, as the figures for the port of Karachi in themselves reflect its chief tendencies. The port is the natural outlet for the surplus produce of the province, which is railed to Karachi for export abroad by sea, and the principal imports into the mofussil districts, with the exception of coal and certain food-grains, are also made through Karachi. Imports of *coal and coke* declined considerably. As in the previous year Sind again imported *sugar* from Calcutta, the actual quantity being 32,139 maunds. Another interesting feature, due of course to the badness of the 1918 inundation, was the import of *rice* from Calcutta, which sent 64,182 maunds during the year under report as compared with 22,824 maunds in the year 1918-19.

11. The appended Statement 1-A shows the total trade of the Punjab with Sind and British Baluchistan by the river Indus during the year 1919-20. The total imports from the Punjab fell from 2,372,709 maunds to 2,247,155 maunds in 1919-20 or by 5 per cent. The total quantity of this trade which took the rail at Sukkur and Kotri was 169,686 maunds as against 364,817 last year. Exports to the Punjab by river fell by 1,670 maunds to 301,030 maunds, of which Karachi sent 138,440 maunds and Sind and British Baluchistan 162,590 maunds as compared with 149,157 and 153,543 maunds, respectively, in 1918-19.

12. A statement showing the value rates adopted for each article for each quarter is attached as Appendix A.

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 18 blocks, *viz.*, nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4) Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; five representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana, (2) Central India, (3) Kashmir, (4) the Nizam's Territory and (5) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay, and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the Import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office, for compilation, by the Examiner of Accounts, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway, Jodhpur.

- (2) The Government Examiner of Accounts, Bombay, Baroda & Central India Railway, Bombay.
- (3) The Examiner of Accounts, Oudh & Rohilkhand Railway, Lucknow.
- (4) The Examiner of Accounts, Eastern Bengal State Railway, Calcutta.
- (5) The Chief Auditor, East Indian Railway, Calcutta.
- (6) The Chief Auditor, Bengal & North-Western Railway, Gorakhpur.
- (7) The Auditor, Bengal-Nagpur Railway, Calcutta.
- (8) The Chief Auditor, Great Indian Peninsula Railway, Bombay (Indian Midland Railway Section).
- (9) The Auditor of Bengal Provincial Railway Company, Limited, Mgra.
- (10) The Auditor of Accounts, Rohilkhand & Kumaon Railway, Bareilly.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River

Indus, Sukkur. The river traffic is adjusted in the return according to the following rules laid down in Government of India letter No. 518/57-3-Statistics, dated the 5th June 1890:—

- I.—When the imports by river from the Punjab exceed the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference as imports from the Punjab into Sind and British Baluchistan.
- II.—When the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi exceed the imports by river from the Punjab, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference plus the imports from other stations in Sind and British Baluchistan to Karachi as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- III.—When the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri exceed the exports by river to the Punjab, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab, and the difference plus the exports from Karachi to Sind (excluding Sukkur and Kotri) as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.
- IV.—When the exports by river to the Punjab exceed the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab and the difference as exports from Sind and British Baluchistan to the Punjab.

The quarterly returns received from the several registering officers are compiled in this office and a consolidated return showing quantities, but no values, is sent every quarter to the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta.

The registering officers give only the weight of the goods in maunds of 82½ lbs. Lists of value rates are supplied by each province quarterly and the values of the trade of each quarter are worked out separately in this office and then added together for the annual returns. The Native States furnish no returns, the trade registered is the trade which comes into and goes out of each block by rail; and the value rates of Sind are adopted in calculating the value of the trade.

Appendix A shows the value rates for Sind and British Baluchistan adopted in each of the four quarters of the year 1919-20 at which the values of the articles in which the trade was carried on are calculated.

(a) The rates of articles marked A in the appendix, which represent the value rates of foreign merchandise, are based on the values declared by the importers in their bills-of-entry at the time of passing the goods out of the Custom House, and may therefore be regarded as approximately accurate.

(b) The rates for articles marked B, which represent articles of Indian merchandise, are supplied by the Director of Agriculture, Bombay, who obtains them from the monthly returns furnished to him by the Huzur Deputy Collectors of Karachi, Hyderabad and Sukkur, which are published by him in the Gazette. They represent the average of the monthly prices ruling on the 20th of each month and may be regarded as reliable.

(c) The rates of articles marked C are the rates fixed once for all in consultation with the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta, and are therefore merely conventional.

(d) The rates of articles marked D in the appendix are obtained by the Director of Agriculture by local inquiry from wholesale dealers in Bombay. In

respect of railway plant, inquiry is made of the B. B. & C. I. and G. I. P. Railway workshops, and in respect of twist and yarn and piece-goods (Indian), the rates are worked out from quotations furnished by the Millowners' Association to the Chamber of Commerce. These rates may be regarded as approximately correct.

(e) The rates of articles marked E, which represent Indian liquors, are supplied by the Abkari Inspector, Karachi.

Table I shows the rail and river-borne trade of the blocks—(1) Karachi and (2) Sind and British Baluchistan with each other as well as with each of the other blocks into which India is divided. In this table the trade of any province under any head which does not exceed Rs. 10,000, in value against either imports or exports has been lumped up and shown against "Other places," the province to which such trade appertains not being specifically shown. A statement showing the river-borne trade separately is also appended and marked I-A.

Table II shows the traffic between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi. The whole of this trade is carried by rail, as there is no direct communication with Karachi by river.

The articles shown in the above tables are arranged in alphabetical order. The classification corresponds in the main with that employed in the sea-borne trade accounts, but is less detailed.

Report on the Rail and River-borne Trade of the Province of Sind and British Baluchistan for the year 1921-22.

1. The system under which the rail and river-borne trade is registered and classified is explained in a note appended to this report. The only change to which effect was given during the year under review was the opening of a new subhead, *vis.*, 'Copra or coconut kernel' under the main heading 'Oilseeds' in the classified list of articles of trade. The arrangement of the blocks into which India is divided for the purposes of this report, and the system of registration remained unchanged.

GENERAL REMARKS.

2. In Sind the rainfall was timely and sufficient. The inundation of the river Indus in 1921 though late was on the whole fair and distinctly better than that of 1920. In the Punjab the total rainfall was normal, and though the canals were late in starting, the monsoon rain water in the canals was sufficient and river levels were high. The climatic conditions in the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh were also equally favourable. Notwithstanding such favourable conditions, traffic on the North-Western Railway showed a considerable decline as compared with the previous year mainly as a result of reduced arrivals of *wheat* from the Punjab and *coal* from Behar and Orissa.

3. Traffic on the river Indus also exhibited a decrease as compared with 1920-21. As usual the bulk of this traffic consisted of imports of food-grains from the Punjab into Sind.

4. *Railway extensions, &c.*—The following new lines were completed and opened for traffic during the year :—

- (1) Double line Chahi to Begmanji on the Sukkur district.
- (2) Mirzawa to Duzdap of the Nushki Extension Railway.
- (3) Nowshera-Durgai Railway conversion to broad gauge—A section from Nowshera-Takht-Bhai.
- (4) Larkana to Shahdadkote, portion of Larkana-Jacobabad Railway.

The lines under construction during the year were—

- (1) Relaying Hyderabad-Badin Railway.
- (2) Double line Peshawar to Kachagarhi.
- (3) Double line Kachagarhi to Jamrud.
- (4) Nowshera-Durgai Railway conversion—Takht-Bhai-Durgai.

8. It will be noticed from the above statement that the import trade of Karachi dwindled in volume by 21,211,363 maunds or by 55 per cent. as compared with 1920-21 and the figures were the lowest in the decade. Wheat, the principal commodity in the rail-borne import trade was responsible for half the deficit, imports having fallen from 13,436,891 maunds to 2,639,928 maunds in 1921-22. This abnormal decrease is explained by the fact that during the last year large quantities of wheat were railed to Karachi for shipment to foreign countries on account of the partial raising of the embargo on exports, while in 1921-22 the quantities imported were inconsiderable owing to the export restrictions having remained in force throughout the year and also to a great shortage of wheat in the Punjab and the consequent high prices. Of the other important articles, coal and coke also showed a marked decline which was partly due to decreased output by the collieries in Bengal and Behar and Orissa on account of labour troubles and partly to shortage of railway wagons. The total quantity which amounted to 255,831 maunds was short of that imported in the previous year by 4,804,550 maunds, and in consequence large quantities had to be imported from foreign countries to make good the deficiency. Imports of rice not in the husk receded from 2,905,219 maunds to 1,163,325 maunds or by 60 per cent. in 1921-22 mainly under receipts from Sind and British Baluchistan where the out-turn of the crop was smaller than that in 1920-21. During the year under report Calcutta sent only 2,530 maunds of rice by rail against 342,908 maunds last year. This decrease was, however, more than counterbalanced by a large increase in imports by sea from that place. A slight increase amounting to 22,471 maunds was recorded under raw cotton in consequence of larger receipts from the Punjab despite a poor crop. Sind cotton was, however, imported in smaller quantities than in the previous year. Exports by sea to foreign countries were smaller than

those in the previous year in consequence of a fall in prices in the consuming markets especially during the export season. Receipts of *hides and skins, raw* which amounted to 156,034 maunds were more than double of those of the previous year, the Punjab being the chief source of supply. The expansion was due to a fall in prices during the year in consequence of which large exports were made to foreign countries by sea. Under *oilseeds*, arrivals of *cotton seed* mainly from Sind and the Punjab declined from 552,200 maunds to 92,723 maunds or by 83 per cent. The decrease was due to a poor demand for exports by sea on account of high prices brought about by a poor cotton crop. There was also a heavy decline to the extent of 319,573 maunds under imports of linseed which totalled only 27,763 maunds. The contraction was due to a reduction in the area and outturn of the crops in the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, the chief source of supply. Notwithstanding a poor crop in Sind, the Punjab and the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, arrivals of *rape and mustard seed* rose from 2,515,767 maunds to 3,300,899 maunds in 1921-22, the Punjab almost solely contributing to the increase. It is interesting to note that of the 2,866,368 maunds sent by the Punjab during the year some 2,458,033 maunds were received during the last quarter. Arrivals from Sind improved from 5,631 to 19,031 maunds, while those from the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh dwindled from 1,266,079 maunds to 330,254 maunds. The quantity of *raw wool* imported by rail showed an excess of 63,636 maunds over the figures of the previous year as a result of larger receipts of Punjab wool for exports by sea to foreign countries where better prices were obtainable.

9. It is noteworthy that the rail-borne *export trade of Karachi* which had decreased considerably since the war has, during the year under review, regained its pre-war level. The principal factor contributing to this improvement was the revival of exports of *sea-borne coal* mainly for *railway purposes* which before the war always swelled the export figures. The aggregate volume of the export trade rose steeply from 8,373,358 maunds to 20,597,329 maunds in 1921-22 or by 146 per cent. Railments of *coal* which amounted to 5,727,854 maunds against 100,084 maunds last year represented 28 per cent. of the aggregate exports. Both Sind and British Baluchistan and the Punjab which were obliged to draw their requirements direct from the mines in Bengal and Behar and Orissa during the post-war years owing to scarcity of sea-borne coal for want of steamer freight took large quantities from this port. A special feature of this year's trade was an item of unusual export, *viz.*, 3,427,463 maunds of foreign *wheat*, some 2,721,802 maunds of which went to the Punjab, a great wheat producing centre. As explained in the foregoing paragraph a great shortage of wheat was experienced in India and it was made good by unprecedented imports from Australia and the United States of America. Of the other important articles comprising the export trade, *cotton piece-goods* of foreign manufacture showed a slight decrease, but those of Indian manufacture fell considerably from 677,668 maunds to 453,984 maunds in 1921-22. Both the Punjab and Sind and British Baluchistan, the chief consuming markets contributed to the decline which followed upon a considerable increase in the previous year. Despatches of *iron and steel* again showed a considerable expansion, the Punjab being the principal purchaser. The increase which amounted to 455,828 maunds was largely due to a heavy fall in prices. An improvement was also noticeable under *kerosene oil*, mainly in exports to Sind and British Baluchistan and the Punjab, the figures for the past two years being 1,668,694 maunds and 2,023,952 maunds, respectively. There was also a striking increase in the railments of *refined sugar*, the quantity exported, *viz.*, 2,849,250 maunds being more than three times the amount exported in the previous year. Better railway facilities enabled the Punjab, our principal customer to draw largely, the figures for the past two years being 486,227 maunds and 2,049,244 maunds, respectively. The increase was also partly due to a heavy fall in prices of Java sugar and partly due to the fact that the local dealers who had large stocks in hand were obliged to dispose of their goods at a heavy loss being hard pressed for money on account of financial stringency.

10. As stated in the previous reports the rail-borne trade of Sind (excluding Karachi) and British Baluchistan is to a large extent reflected in the figures for

the port of Karachi itself and therefore does not need much separate comment. The surplus produce of the province is railed to Karachi for exports by sea, and its principal requirements are, with the exception of coal and certain food-grains, mainly drawn through Karachi. It is, however, worthy of note that the trade in coal which was practically confined to imports by rail from Behar and Orissa and Bengal since the war owing to the scarcity of steamer freight has, during the year under report, again diverted to Karachi to a great extent. Of the total receipts of 4,941,766 maunds some 3,278,656 maunds, were drawn from this port and 1,597,374 maunds from Bihar and Orissa and Bengal.

11. The appended Statement 1-A shows the total trade of the Punjab with Sind and British Baluchistan by the river Indus during the year 1921-22. The total imports from the Punjab fell from 2,159,040 maunds to 1,559,630 maunds in 1921-22 or by 28 per cent. The total quantity of this trade which took the rail at Sukkur and Kotri was 167,070 maunds as against 726,626 maunds last year. Exports to the Punjab by river declined by 66,100 maunds to 242,460 maunds, of which Karachi sent 135,440 maunds and Sind and British Baluchistan 107,020 maunds as against 144,875 and 163,685 maunds, respectively, in 1920-21.

12. A statement showing the value rates adopted for each article for each quarter is attached as Appendix A.

NOTE.

For the purpose of the inland trade statistics, the whole of India is divided into 18 blocks, *viz.*, nine blocks representing the British Provinces—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Sind and British Baluchistan, (4), Bengal, (5) Bihar and Orissa, (6) United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, (7) Punjab, (8) Central Provinces and Berar, and (9) Assam; five representing the Native States—(1) Rajputana (2) Central India, (3) Kashmir, (4) the Nizam's Territory and (5) Mysore; and four representing the chief seaport towns—(1) Madras, (2) Bombay, (3) Karachi and (4) Calcutta. The trade of Native States which lie within the external boundaries of a British province is included in the trade of that province. Under this arrangement of blocks, the trade exhibited under Sind and British Baluchistan represents the trade of the province of Sind and British Baluchistan, including the Native State of Khairpur, but excluding the seaport town of Karachi, the trade of which is shown separately. Similarly, the trade shown against Madras, Bombay and Bengal represents the trade of those provinces, exclusive of the seaport towns of Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, respectively. The work of registering the trade is performed by the principal railway audit offices.

The required information is collected from railway invoices which show the description of goods, the places from which they are sent and at which they are delivered and their gross actual weights. The weight recorded in the tables represents net weight, which is obtained by deducting a certain percentage (which is fixed at different rates for the several classes of goods, for packing materials) from gross actual weight.

Information in respect of the Import trade by rail is supplied every quarter to this office, for compilation, by the Chief Auditor, North-Western Railway, Lahore, and the Auditor, Jodhpur-Bikaner Railway, Jodhpur.

The figures of the Export trade are furnished by—

- (1) The Chief Auditor, North-Western Railway, Lahore.
- (2) The Government Examiner of Accounts, Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway, Bombay.
- (3) The Chief Auditor, Oudh and Rohilkhand Railway, Lucknow.
- (4) The Chief Auditor, Eastern Bengal State Railway, Calcutta.
- (5) The Chief Auditor, East Indian Railway, Calcutta.
- (6) The Chief Auditor, Bengal and North-Western Railway, Gorakhpur.
- (7) The Auditor, Bengal-Nagpur Railway, Calcutta.
- (8) The Chief Auditor, Great Indian Peninsula, Railway, Bombay (Indian Midland Railway Section).
- (9) The Auditor of Bengal Provincial Railway Company, Limited, Magra.
- (10) The Auditor of Accounts, Rohilkhand and Kumaon, Railway, Bareilly.

The river-borne trade represents the trade carried by country boats plying on the Indus between the Punjab and Sind and is registered at Sukkur and Kotri by clerks who collect the information from boatmen, and the statistics are furnished to this office by the Deputy Conservator and Registrar, River Indus, Sukkur. The river traffic is adjusted in the return according to the following rules laid down in Government of India letter No. 518/57-3-Statistics, dated the 5th June 1890:—

- I.—When the imports by river from the Punjab exceed the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference as imports from the Punjab into Sind and British Baluchistan.



II.—When the imports by rail from Sukkur and Kotri into Karachi exceed the imports by river from the Punjab, the latter are classed as imports from the Punjab into Karachi and the difference plus the imports from other stations in Sind and British Baluchistan to Karachi as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.

III.—When the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri exceed the exports by river to the Punjab, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab, and the difference plus the exports from Karachi to Sind (excluding Sukkur and Kotri) as trade between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi.

IV.—When the exports by river to the Punjab exceed the exports by rail from Karachi to Sukkur and Kotri, the latter are classed as exports from Karachi to the Punjab and the difference as exports from Sind and British Baluchistan to the Punjab.

The quarterly returns received from the several registering officers are compiled in this office and a consolidated return showing quantities, but no values, is sent every quarter to the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta.

The registering officers give only the weight of the goods in maunds of 82½ lbs. Lists of value rates are supplied by each province quarterly, and the values of the trade of each quarter are worked out separately in this office and then added together for the annual returns. The Native States furnish no returns, the trade registered is the trade which comes into and goes out of each block by rail; and the value rates of Sind are adopted in calculating the value of the trade.

Appendix A shows the value rates for Sind and British Baluchistan adopted in each of the four quarters of the year 1921-22 at which the values of the articles in which the trade was carried on are calculated.

(a) The rates of articles marked A (in the appendix), which represent the value rates of foreign merchandise, are based on the values declared by the importers in their bills of entry at the time of passing the goods out of the Custom House, and may therefore be regarded as approximately accurate.

(b) The rates for articles marked B, which represent articles of Indian merchandise, are supplied by the Director of Agriculture, Bombay, who obtains them from the monthly returns furnished to him by the Huzur Deputy Collectors of Karachi, Hyderabad and Sukkur, which are published by him in the Gazette. They represent the average of the monthly prices ruling on the 20th of each month and may be regarded as reliable.

(c) The rates of articles marked C are the rates fixed once for all in consultation with the Director of Statistics with the Government of India, Calcutta, and are therefore merely conventional.

(d) The rates of articles marked D in the appendix are obtained by the Director of Agriculture by local inquiry from wholesale dealers in Bombay. In respect of railway plant, inquiry is made of the B. B. C. I. & G. I. P. Railway workshops, and in respect of twist and yarn and piece-goods (Indian) the rates are worked out from quotations furnished by the Millowners' Association to the Chamber of Commerce. These rates may be regarded as approximately correct.

(e) The rates of articles marked E, which represent Indian liquors, are supplied by the Abkari Inspector, Karachi.

Table I shows the rail and river-borne trade of the blocks—(1) Karachi and (2) Sind and British Baluchistan with each other as well as with each of the other blocks into which India is divided. In this table the trade of any province under any head which does not exceed Rs. 10,000 in value against either imports or exports has been lumped up and shown against "Other places," the province to which such trade appertains not being specifically shown. A statement showing the river-borne trade separately is also appended and marked I-A.

Table II shows the traffic between Sind and British Baluchistan and Karachi. The whole of this trade is carried by rail, as there is no direct communication with Karachi by river.

The articles shown in the above tables are arranged in alphabetical order. The classification corresponds in the main with that employed in the sea-borne trade accounts, but is less detailed.
