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9. *Local Rates.*—The increase of Rs. 62,000 was shared by the Divisions except the Northern Division. The decrease in the Bombay Suburban Division is too small to need any comment. In the Northern Division all the Districts except Thana recorded decreases amounting to Rs. 2,27,839. In Thana the increase of Rs. 26,000 was due to the raising of the local fund cess from 1 anna to 2 annas. The decrease in other districts was due to the fact that whereas in the previous year on account of the favourableness of the season it was possible to recover the suspended arrears of the local fund cess, the year under review in Kaira and Broach was lean and recovery had to be suspended. The considerable increase of Rs. 2,31,922 in the Central Division was shared by all the Districts except Satara and was due generally to the collection of arrears of previous years. In the Ahmednagar District it was partly due to the levy of additional one anna local fund cess and the cess on Irrigation revenue and in the East Khandesh district it was due to the revision settlement in three talukas of the district. In the Southern Division there were increases in Belgaum (61,000), Dharwar (5,000) and Ratnagiri (7,000) counterbalanced by decreases in Bijapur (37,000) and Kolaba (8,000) resulting in a net increase of Rs. 28,000. In Sind there was an increase of 30,000 which was shared by the Karachi, Hyderabad, Larkana, Thar Parkar and Upper Sind Frontier Local Boards and was due to the levy of the local fund cess at the enhanced rate of one anna and three pies in the rupee of land revenue.

10. *Police.*—Sind was chiefly responsible for the increase under this head.

11. *Education.*—The large increase of Rs. 7,47,000, which was shared by Sind and all the Divisions, except the Northern Division, was generally due to enhanced Government grants for the revision of pay of school masters and for maintenance of primary schools.

12. *Medical.*—The increase under this head was due to the receipt by the East Khandesh Board of a contribution from the Red Cross Fund and to the recovery by the Nasik Board of the share from the Trimbak Municipality for Sinhast Sanitary arrangement charges originally spent by the Board.

13. *Miscellaneous.*—The increase under this head was almost wholly contributed by Sind. It was due to the sale of the old musafirkhana at Thul in the Upper Sind Frontier District and to the receipt in full of the Government grants by the District Local Boards of Sukkur, Larkana and Thar Parkar on account of their Chief Officers and the clerical establishment.

14. *Civil Works.*—There was an increase of Rs. 3,84,000 under this head in the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions and in Sind. The increase is attributed to (a) increased Government grants for improvements of communications, water supply and other public works, (b) larger bids received from toll and ferry contractors and (c) enhanced realisations from the sale proceeds of trees especially in Sind.

15. The incidence of Local Board taxation per head of population was lowest in the Bombay Suburban Division (Re. 0-1-4) and highest in Sind (Re. 0-5-0) and averaged Re. 0-3-6 for the whole Presidency. The incidence of income per head of population varied from Re. 0-14-6 in the Southern Division to Rs. 1-4-6 in the Northern Division and averaged Re. 0-15-2 for the whole Presidency.

16. *Debt.*—The increase under this head was shared by the Central and Northern Divisions. In Ahmednagar it was due to the advance of Rs. 94,000 received from Government on account of overdrafts and in Sholapur to the special advance of Rs. 25,000 given for the payment of primary teachers' pay. In the Northern Division the increase was due to the receipt of a larger number of deposits from contractors in all districts and from owners of wells for boring purposes in the Kaira District.

17. *Expenditure.*—The aggregate expenditure of the boards (excluding debt items) stood at Rs 1.52 lakhs as against Rs. 1,45 lakhs in the previous

year. The following statement exhibits the distribution of expenditure under the several heads as compared with that in the preceding year:—

The most important variations in the above figures are commented on below.

18. *Administration.*—The increase was shared by all the Divisions and Sind and is ascribed to the following main causes:—

- (i) increments to Local Board officers and clerks,
- (ii) payment of audit fees to Government,
- (iii) travelling allowance to members and officers of the Board.

19. *Education.*—In the Northern Division the expenditure on education remained almost stationary being Rs. 21,73,813 as against Rs. 21,61,542 in the preceding year. The decrease of Rs. 44,000 in the Central Division was due to smaller expenditure on primary schools. In the Southern Division, Dharwar was responsible for an increase of Rs. 55,000 mainly due to the grant of pay to teachers according to the revised scale. Kolaba and Ratnagiri also contributed an increase of Rs. 5,000 each on the same account. The increase in Kanara (Rs. 15,000) was due to the opening of 7 boys' and 3 girls' schools and to revision of the pay of school masters, and that in Belgaum (Rs. 8,000) was due to payment of increments to teachers. The decrease in Bijapur (Rs. 17,000) was due partly to the withholding for want of funds all payments on account of educational matters and partly to the fixed pay given to primary school teachers, in lieu of temporary and provisional allowance. In Sind the increase of Rs. 97,000 was on account of the following causes:—

- (1) Grant of Sind allowance and revised pay to primary school teachers.
- (2) Re-opening of some of the schools closed down last year in the Thar Parkar District.

20. *Medical.*—The large increase of Rs. 1,76,000 was shared by all the Divisions and Sind. The increase of Rs. 90,000 in the Central Division was due (1) to the payment of arrear contributions on account of pay of medical officers, (2) to the increased cost of medical stores supplied to dispensaries and (3) to the contribution towards pay and allowances to Local Fund Vaccinators. In Sind (Rs. 8,000) and in the Southern Division (Rs. 23,000) the increases were due more or less to the same causes. The Districts of Poona, Belgaum and Dharwar were affected by plague and timely measures were taken by the Boards to check the evil. Owing to financial stringency, the District Local Board, Dharwar, discontinued its contributions to certain medical institutions. The increase in the Northern Division (Rs. 49,763) was also nominal due to the payment by the Broach, Surat and Thana District Local Boards of the salaries of medical officers for past years according to the revised scale and of the cost of medical stores purchased in former years. The increase in Thana is attributed to the opening of a new dispensary at Bhayandar.

21. *Scientific and other minor Departments.*—The decrease is shared by Sind and by the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions. In Sind the decrease (Rs. 15,500) was effected by (1) reduced expenditure of veterinary dispensaries and maintenance of stallions (2) retrenchment in garden establishment and (3) non-holding of the agricultural and Cattle shows. In the Southern Division two new Veterinary dispensaries were opened at Dharwar one in Navalgund and the other in Nargund, and a Veterinary dispensary building at Kumta in Kanara was completed.

22. *Miscellaneous.*—The increase mainly occurred in the Central and Southern Divisions as a result of the payment of arrear contributions to Government on account of the pay of the Taluka Local Board clerks. The increase in the Poona District was due to the payment of larger amounts to municipalities on account of refund of cess collected in their areas. In the Northern Division the increase (Rs. 8,000) was due to various causes, the chief being the refund of the contribution on account of the Veterinary dispensary at Eru in Surat which was built by the donor himself and the payment for the additions made to the dispensary buildings at Dahanu in the Thana District.

23. *Civil Works.*—Rs. 2,44,236 more were expended under this head than in the previous year. Sind and all the Divisions except the Central Division contributed to the increase, the Northern Division showing the greatest increase namely Rs. 1,73,580. The expenditure for the whole Presidency represents 26 per cent. of the entire expenditure of the Boards against a corresponding proportion of 25 per cent. in the preceding year. A comparison of the figures of expenditure incurred under the several sub-heads with the corresponding ones of the preceding year is made in the following statement:—

24. *Buildings.*—In the Northern Division the expenditure on original works increased from Rs. 16,361 to Rs. 47,861 as several useful buildings were constructed, the chief of them being the office buildings for Bassein and North Salsette Taluka Local Boards, the school houses at Chikhli and Halol for girls and an Urdu Boys' school building at Kalol in the Panch Mahals District. In the Southern Division the increase is accounted for by the construction of new offices for Taluka Local Boards of Ranebennur and Gadag in Dharwar and by the construction of four new buildings and to the acquisition of a site for a dispensary building at Rewadanda in Kolaba. The new buildings constructed in Sind were 12 school houses, 3 cattle-pounds and 7 musafirkhanas.

25. *Communications.*—In the Northern Division an increase of about Rs. 34,000 is noticeable under original works of communications, the Taluka Local Boards of Kaira and Surat having spent large sums on the construction of new roads from Nadiad to Umreth, from Dakor to Umreth and Matar to Cambay in the Kaira District and from Olpad to Karanj, and Jalalpor to Salej in the Surat District. In the Southern Division the increase on original works is attributed to (1) the construction of a large causeway across the Hiranyakeshi river in Belgaum at a cost of Rs. 27,000 (2) the construction of a bridge over the Mallapur—Idugundi road in Kanara and (3) the acquisition of lands for new road from Nagothna to Roha II section. In Sind the increase occurred in all the districts except Thar Parkar.

26. *Water Supply.*—In Sind 19 wells were sunk and three tanks constructed during the year under review. Much activity was shown in Kaira and Broach towards the improvement of the village water supply, a problem which had become acute on account of the scarcity of rainfall. Government had to make special grants in addition to the ordinary annual grants for water supply to the District Local Boards of Ahmedabad, Kaira, Panch Mahals and Broach which spent during the year under report about Rs. 32,000 more on original works and about Rs. 44,000 more on repairs than in the previous year.

27. *Tools and Plant.*—The chief increase was in the Northern Division (Rs. 14,000) due to the purchase by the District Local Board, Kaira, of survey instruments and rollers, etc.

28. *Closing Balances.*—The opening and closing balances of the District Local Boards are tabulated by Divisions in the statement appended to this Resolution. The Boards closed their annual accounts with an aggregate balance of  $45 \frac{1}{4}$  lakhs being more than that of the preceding year by  $4 \frac{3}{4}$  lakhs. The Central and Southern Divisions and Sind were chiefly responsible for the comparative increase contributing Rs. 6, 1.20 and 1.20 lakhs respectively. The increase was counterbalanced by a decrease of Rs. 3.30 lakhs and of Rs. .35 lakh in the Northern and Bombay Suburban Divisions, respectively. As has been often noted in the previous reports, the closing balances are largely in excess of the minima prescribed by section 89 of the Act and remain an unwelcome and conspicuous object in the report. In the Northern Division the reasons which are reported to be common to all districts having excess balances are (1) the receipt of the revenue for the succeeding year before the close of the year under report (2) the inclusion of the balances of the educational, medical and Veterinary funds and (3) the savings on account of works remaining unfinished at the close of the financial year. In the Central Division the closing balance of the Ahmednagar District includes an advance of Rs. 94,000 on account of overdrawal which was repaid to Government in May 1924. Of the excess in West Khandesh, Rs. 82,995 represent the Educational balance and Rs. 60,718 the balance of Taluka Local Boards and the remaining sum represents the balance of the District Local Board proper. The reason for the large balances kept by Taluka Local Boards is reported to be mostly due to the non-completion of the budgetted works during the year owing to scarcity of labour and high prices of materials and in the case of the educational balances, they were due to the grant from Government having been received late. The increase in the Nasik District was due to the collection of arrears of local fund cess and the receipt of the increased educational grants. In Satara the educational balance still continues to be large as the work of constructing new school houses was kept pending the formation of a school board under the Bombay Primary Education Act, 1923. Of the excess in Sholapur, Rs. 63,983 represent the Educational balance. The reasons for the remaining excess are that the actual proceeds of one anna cess, ferries, tolls, fees on sand and quarries, cattle pound receipts, etc., were far in excess of the estimated amounts. Moreover, some amounts provided for road repairs could not be wholly spent during the year owing to want of rain required for rolling purposes. In the Southern Division all

the Boards show excess balances. The reasons assigned for the unspent balances are :—

*Belgaum.*—The educational balance of Rs. 2,84,000 consists of the reserve of Rs. 83,000 for the purposes of the Bombay Primary Education Act, 1923. A portion of this balance has to be refunded to Government as excess of grants wrongly credited. The remaining amount will be required for payment of supplementary claims of teachers on account of revision of pay, and for opening new schools and construction of school buildings.

*Bijapur.*—The total balance with the Taluka Local Boards was over Rs. 40,000 and the Collector has remarked that there appears to be something wrong somewhere when the District Local Board is in such straits for funds. Government will be glad to learn the result of the Collector's enquiry.

*Dharwar.*—The excess is ascribed to the receipt of the Government grant too near the close of the year on account of revised pay of teachers and to the non-utilisation of part of the Educational funds received for the construction of school buildings and to the non-utilisation of allotments made to Taluka Local Boards for public works which have not been carried out owing to scarcity of labour.

*Kanara, Kolaba and Ratnagiri.*—The bulk of the balance consists of educational grants. The question of the utilisation of the amount of Rs. 52,000 set apart for the Industrial School at Kolaba was disposed of. The Konkan Education Society and two other private bodies asked for the amount for a scheme of technical education. The District Local Board, Kolaba, accepted the scheme as a trial for 3 years during which only the interest on the amount will be paid to the Society, the amount itself being invested in the Central Co-operative Bank of Bombay as a fixed deposit.

As regards Sind the increase in the closing balance of the District Local Board, Karachi, is ascribed to receipts on account of the one anna cess and fisheries exceeding the estimated amounts by Rs. 32,000 and 1,100 respectively and the sum of Rs. 83,000 remaining unspent owing to non-completion of the works during the year. The Board also had an unspent balance amounting to Rs. 35,000 on account of the Tatta-Sujawal Ferry Replacement Fund. The present steamer, being an old one and unserviceable, has been replaced by a new one and towards the cost of which Government have sanctioned a grant-in-aid of Rs. 78,000 and promised a loan of an amount of Rs. 48,000. The Educational balance of the Karachi District amounted to over Rs. 43,000, which is due partly to the fact that the income from the one anna cess greatly exceeded the estimated amount and partly to the non-completion of some of the works during the year. In Hyderabad, the increase in the educational balance was due partly to the levy of the local cess at the enhanced rate of one anna and three pies instead of one anna in the rupee and partly to the non-completion of some of the works during the year. The excess in the general balance of the Sukkur District is attributed to the non-payment of some of the claims which were received late and incomplete, and to the non-completion during the year of some of the works. The deficit in the educational balance is ascribed to a portion of the Government grant (Rs. 12,300) not having been credited during the year under report. The reasons assigned for the large unspent general balance of the Larkana District amounting to 1 lakh are the non-payment of bills for some of the works completed during the year owing to their late receipt or non-receipt and the setting aside of a large sum for the District Local Board office building. The excess in the general balance of the Nawabshah District is attributed to the non-completion and non-execution of some of the works during the year. The reasons given for the excess in the educational balance of the Upper Sind Frontier District are the enhancement of the local rate from one anna to one anna and three pies in the rupee of land revenue and the receipt of the additional Government grant at the end of the year.

29. *Works Committees.*—The operations of these committees were on the whole not progressive especially in Sind and in the Southern Division but the generality of the members showed a fair amount of interest in the supervision of works. The grant of travelling allowance to members inspecting the works has helped to make the supervision work more effective. The tendency on the part of villagers to execute the village works even where Panchayats have been framed has been gradually disappearing. In the Northern Division the bulk of the really important work of supervision fell on the non-official Presidents and Vice-Presidents of Taluka Local Boards. In the Central Division the members have begun to show more interest in inspection work. In the Ahmednagar District the piece-work system was followed as far as possible by the District Local Board, but in the case of large works the system of giving works on contract will have to be resorted to in view of the number of works of Provincial roads and buildings transferred to the Board. In the West Khandesh District no Works Committee was appointed by the District Local Board and all its works were carried out through the Public Works Department agency. However, the Taluka Local Boards in that District have appointed Works Committees. In the Nasik, Sholapur and Satara Districts Works Committees were appointed and the Presidents of the District Local Boards concerned have reported that members have begun to take more interest in the execution of works. In the Southern Division there are no complaints regarding these Committees as in the past except in Dharwar where the President comments adversely on the apathy of members of the Works Committees. He remarks that the Works Committees of Taluka Local Boards did not meet regularly. He also points out that the members entrusted with the supervision of the execution of works visited works, after their completion, only for signing measurement books and works bills, and rendered very little help to the executive staff. In Sind the members with a few noteworthy exceptions evinced very little interest in the works executed in their talukas.

30. *Audit of Accounts.*—The audit notes received from the Examiner, Local Fund Accounts, show that in the Southern Division much improvement has been effected by the Boards in maintaining their accounts in proper order. The Auditors still complained of bad work in respect of the public works section. The common irregularities of this section are:—

- (1) deviations from the sanctioned estimates,
- (2) rush of expenditure at the end of the year,
- (3) want of closer supervision by the Local Board members over works under construction; and
- (4) non-maintenance of measurement book which is the initial record of all accounts of quantities and qualities of the works in the P. W. D. section.

Government hope that these defects will gradually disappear with the appointment of qualified staffs, and the adoption of stringent measures against the defaulters by the Boards. In Kolaba a sub-overseer was dismissed for recording faulty measurements, and in Kanara criminal proceedings were instituted against the Chairman of the Works Committee and the Sub-overseer at Sirsi for forgery. The Dharwar District Local Board have decided to recover from the sub-overseers concerned the amounts spent in excess of the sanctioned estimates. An Accountant employed in the office of the Bombay Suburban District Local Board was prosecuted for the defalcations committed by him to the extent of Rs. 6,289. The Court of Sessions, Thana, to which he was committed, convicted him on two counts of criminal breach of trust in his capacity as a public servant and sentenced him to rigorous imprisonment for 1 year on each count, the two sentences to run concurrently and to pay a fine of Rs. 5,000 in all or to undergo further rigorous imprisonment for 9 weeks. It is reported that a sum of Rs. 1,270 has already been recovered from the convict and steps are being taken to recover the balance from his estate.

31. *General Remarks.*—It was expected that fresh elections would be held during the year under review and the constitution of new Local Boards under the Bombay Local Boards Act, 1923, would come into force from the

1st April 1924. But the rules fixing the constitutions and the constituencies not having been finally published, the elections could not be held. No progress was also made in the field of compulsory primary education. The general question of transferring the management and control of primary education to the local authorities under the Bombay Primary Education Act, 1923; was postponed till the District Local Board elections were held under the new franchise.

32. None of the District Local Boards in the Northern Division has availed itself of the opportunities offered by Act VI of 1923, for the expansion of revenue, except in Thana where the District Local Board raised the local fund cess from one anna to two annas. The Bombay Suburban District Local Board has decided to enhance the rate of local fund cess to two annas in its district with effect from the 1st August 1925. In the Central Division the following Boards have taken advantage of the powers of additional taxation conferred on them by the new Act. The Ahmednagar District Local Board has increased the local fund cess to a rate of two annas on every rupee of land revenue from the 1st August 1923 and has decided to levy one anna cess on every rupee of water rate from the 1st October 1923. Similarly, the District Local Boards, East Khandesh, Sholapur and Satara have increased the rate of local fund cess to anna one and six pies, annas two and annas two, respectively, on every rupee of land revenue. In Sind all the District Local Boards increased their revenue by raising the rate of the local fund cess by 25 per cent. It is regrettable to note that, with the exception of Belgaum, which raised the local fund cess to 2 annas, none of the Boards in the Southern Division has made any progress in this direction.

33. The extra revenue from the levy of the increased cess is still considered to be inadequate for meeting the various wants of the Boards. Most of the Boards are generally adverse to fresh or additional taxation, the reason being apparently fear of unpopularity. If the Boards are to find the necessary funds for the expansion of primary education they must be prepared to face temporary unpopularity and take with courage and decision advantage of the new methods of raising income provided by the Act.

34. Two informal conferences of the Presidents and other representatives of District Local Boards were held under the Chairmanship of the Honourable Khan Bahadur Shaikh Ghulam Husain Hidavatallah, Minister for Local Self Government on the 7th August 1924 and 18th November 1924 to discuss various questions, including that of taxation in connection with the administration of District Local Boards. The outstanding proposal made at the conferences was in connection with the subject of grants to the Boards by Government. As a result of the discussion, Government have appointed a Committee consisting of officials and non-officials to consider and report on the question of financial help to the District Local Boards in this Presidency. The Committee assembled at Poona on the 16th July 1925 and has been requested to report on the following points:—

- (i) To consider whether the existing grant-in-aid system should be replaced by a system whereunder Government should contribute an annual subsidy to District Local Boards on a percentage basis, i.e., Government should give a lump grant bearing a fixed ratio to the actual approved expenditure of the Boards on all objects other than *primary* education, the grant being based on the actuals of the previous year.
- (ii) To consider what this ratio should be.
- (iii) To consider whether the ratio should be the same for each District Local Board or whether it should vary according to the wealth and natural resources of each Board.
- (iv) To consider what additional revenue the District Local Boards are likely to be able to realise by local taxation.

35. Another question considered by the conferences was the best method of promoting the success of the Village Panchayats. The reports of the Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners of Divisions on the working of the Panchayats for the three years ending 1923-24 show that the results so far obtained are far from encouraging. They are all of opinion that the Panchayats have proved a failure. However, they consider that as these institutions are still in their initial stage, a further trial should be given to them, as it would be yet premature to say whether or not they have justified their creation. The following have been mentioned as the main causes of their failure :—

- (1) The institution is in advance of public opinion, and the people are not ready for it.
- (2) The compulsory levy of house-tax is distasteful to the villagers to whom indirect taxation does not appear to be so objectionable.
- (3) The want of provision for nomination in the Bombay Village Panchayats Act, 1920, owing to which the abolition of panchayats is inevitable when candidates refuse to stand for election.
- (4) The inadequacy of funds.
- (5) The general illiteracy and apathy of villagers and the existence of village factions.
- (6) The inexperience of the members who are usually devoid of any sense of public duty.
- (7) Want of adequate powers, especially petty Civil and Criminal powers.

36. Government after careful consideration have come to the conclusion that the whole position requires to be thoroughly investigated. They have therefore appointed a Committee to enquire into the matter and make recommendations, which assembled at Poona on the 13th July 1925. Government await with interest the recommendations of this and of the Local Boards Committee.

37. It is to be noted that the District Local Board, Ahmednagar, has made provision of funds for opening 5 Ayurvedic dispensaries to be conducted by native physicians. Also the District Local Board, Satara, has opened two Ayurvedic dispensaries in addition to the two already existing. Whatever view be taken of the utility of these institutions Government agree with the remarks made by the Collector of Satara in questioning the correctness of the statement that "it is being accepted on all sides" that the "Ayurvedic system on its medical side is efficient."

38. The most encouraging feature in the reports is the enthusiasm and energy shown by all the District Local Boards, their Presidents and Vice-Presidents in carrying out their duties, although, as is natural, some show to better advantage than others. But as the Commissioner, S. D., indicates, finance is their chief stumbling block.

39. It is a matter for constant remark that Local Boards find themselves hampered by lack of funds and at the same time cannot prevent themselves from accumulating large balances at the end of the year. It is possibly this fact among others that renders individual members of Boards reluctant to take active steps to increase the resources of their Boards by means of taxation. The analysis given in paragraph 28 (above) discloses various reasons for these large balances, some of which are sufficient. In most cases, however, the balances appear to be due to avoidable causes. There are three methods by which the Boards can make a better utilization of their resources :—

- (1) by decrease of their annual balances;
- (2) by providing for capital works out of loan funds;
- (3) by increased taxation.

40. As regards item (1) the Boards as a whole do not appear to take advantage of their balances to earn interest. From the Statement of Income Heading XII it appears that only Ahmedabad and Surat Boards earn any considerable sum as interest, the one deriving Rs. 9,709 and the other 12,494. There are no other Boards that earn more than Rs. 2,000. The sums earned by the different Boards are in no way proportional to the balances. And even if the balances are reduced to the minimum, the interest obtainable should rarely be less than Rs. 1,000.

41. Balances may be reduced by more careful budgeting. This includes the anticipation of receipts from extra revenue such as increased cesses, and from grants sanctioned or sanction of which may be reasonably expected, so as to permit payment in the budget year; and the recognition of the fact that some works are likely to fall behind their programme owing to lack of contractors, shortage of rain (in the case of roads) and other causes. It may happen that one work cannot be completed according to programme and another can be pushed in advance of the programme. The emergency can be met by reappropriation. If this device is for any reason found impracticable, anticipated savings may be calculated in bulk from the average of previous years and made the subject of a special provision. This procedure may occasionally involve unexpected encroachment upon the minimum balance, but the meeting of emergencies is the purpose for which a balance is intended. So long as the minimum balance is budgetted for, the requirements of Government will be fulfilled. The necessity for proper method and organisation in the arrangement of works emphasized by Government in paragraph 28 of last year's resolution (Government Resolution, General Department, no. P.-52 of 2nd July 1924) must also not be forgotten as an essential preliminary of more adequate methods of finance. Government will be prepared to consider grant of advances in lieu of over-drawals in suitable cases. When lump sums are being provided specially for savings on the expenditure side, the excess revenue or grant anticipated should also be provided on the receipt side.

42. *Item (2).*—Government have remarked in paragraph 15 of the same Resolution that it is the usual practice of Local Boards to finance capital works from current revenue. Works of lasting utility from which revenue is derived such as water works, can legitimately be financed by means of loans with the effect of relieving the cesspayer.

43. *Item (3)* has been made the subject of comment in paragraph 33 above. The various means of improving the finances of the Boards cannot be carried out without special attention to finance and audit. For this purpose a special Finance or Budget Committee may suitably be appointed. Its function will be the preparation of the Budget, the investment of the Board's Funds under section 74 (1) of the Bombay Local Boards Act, 1923, and similar matters. It will also sanction or recommend reappropriations. If it also undertakes audit duties, it will arrange for monthly audit of accounts and suggest rules therefor, where they do not exist. The District Board Finance Committee may in virtue of the general control of the District over Taluka Local Boards under section 51 (1) provide for periodical, partial or full audit of the work and accounts of the Taluka Local Boards, some of which last year were seriously at fault. The annual audit by the Examiner, Local Fund Accounts cannot be expected to do more than discover mistakes which have occurred during the year. It rests with the Boards themselves to prevent them. The entertainment of a special audit staff by the District Local Boards will in time probably be found advisable.

44. The services of the following gentlemen have been mentioned as having been of special value to the districts in which they held office.
