Such articles of personal use and ornament are to be reserved for the Ameer as may be selected for that purpose by the Governor-general of *India* in Council, with the approbation of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury. Subject to this reservation, and to a deduction from each share of the amount of six months' full *batta* paid to the captors, the above property has been granted as prize.

No portion of the booty has been retained for the use of the *East India Company*.
