


Do. Central and Deccan Irrigation Divisions.


Index map of the Indus Right and Left Bank Divisions.




View of Scouring Stuices on Right Bank Looking from Downstream




GODMARI CANAIS HEADMORKS.
RIGHT BANK CANAI, HEAD REGULATOR AND SCOURING SICICES (View from Water side.)









FULL VIEW OF THE DAM, 155 FFET HIGH (Upstream Face from South Bank)






(Front View of Head Regulator and Side View of Scouring Sluices.,





### IRRIGATION WORKS IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY FOR 1918-19.

#### I.—GENERAL.

#### A - DETAILS OF DIRECT EXPENDITURE.

In the year 1918-19 the direct expenditure (excluding collection charges) on all the Irrigation Works throughout the Presidency amounted to Rs. 76 lakhs compared with Rs. 74 lakhs in the previous year, and Rs. 76½ lakhs, the average of the last three years. The total is classified and divided between the Presidency proper and Sind as follows:—

#### C.—FIGURES FOR OTHER THAN CAPITAL WORKS.

5. These may be works for which only Revenue Accounts are kept, or works for which neither Capital nor Revenue Accounts are kept. The former are termed Second Class Irrigation Works in the Presidency (excluding Sind). The receipts on these works are principally in the form of a share of the Land Revenue and are termed "Indirect" and as such are book credits, so that figures of revenue appearing in the Finance Accounts, as distinguished from the Statistical Statements accompanying the Irrigation Administration Report, are very small, being for direct revenue only, vis., proceeds from sale of water, etc. The area of irrigation on these very numerous works is always large, but it fluctuates to

some extent with the seasons. The following statements give a comparison of this year's and the average of the last three years' figures :- .

#### D.-REVIEW OF IRRIGATION.

- 6. The different conditions obtaining in Sind and in the Presidency proper are Description of brought out strikingly in a general review of irrigation. Irrigation by means of wells is irrigation, of a uniform type in the whole of the Presidency, but canal irrigation in Sind differs entirely from the canal and tank irrigation in the Deccar and Gujarát.
- 7. Owing to the scanty and precarious character of the rainfall in Sind, irrigation is almost the only means by which the land can be cultivated. Although Sind for the most part is a flat country and has mostly a very fertile soil, the land presents everywhere the appearance of a desert until it is brought under irrigation.
- 8. The river Indus being the main source of water supply of the canals in Sind, all the canals, with a few exceptions, receive water from June to September during the inundation of the river and their flow is very variable. They can have but a scanty supply of water with a low river, while a fairly high and long-lasting inundation permits of the wide-spread cultivation of valuable crops.

9. In the Deccan and Gujarát cultivation chiefly depends upon rainfall and the tanks and canals are mainly useful for the purpose of growing the more valuable crops or to counteract, when required, the evil effect of years of drought. The larger irrigation schemes in this part of the Presidency involve the construction of costly storage reservoirs.

Inundation and rainfall in Sind,

10. The inundation of 1918 was one of the lowest on record, the prominent feature of the year being the unusually high river at the commencement of the season giving promise of a very favourable inundation which, however, failed to be realized. rainfall for the year was negligible and its absence at a time when it was most urgently required contributed to the generally inferior crop results of the year. Taking Sind as a whole, the crops which suffered most were cereals, but the cotton crop in the two Jamrao Districts was nearly a record in area and a bumper one in yield.

Rainfall in the Deccan and Guiarat.

11. In the Deccan and Gujarát the rainfall of the year was from the very beginning not only deficient but was also very badly distributed and consequently there was a wide-spread failure of the whole cultivation except the crops that were irrigated.

Area irrigated and gross revenue.

- 12. The area irrigated in Sind during the year under review was over 21 million acres or about 1/5th of the total culturable area of the province and the gross revenue amounted to about 643 lakhs of rupees, the average figures for the previous triennium being a little over 3½ million acres and 88 lákhs of rupees, respectively.
- 13. The total area irrigated in the Deccan and Gujarát was about 32 lákhs of acres only out of nearly 29 million acres of culturable area. The revenue from all sources was a little more than 17 lakhs of rupees as against 22 lakhs, the average of the previous triennium.

#### II.—SIND.

#### 1.-NATURE OF INUNDATION AND RAINFALL

Character of inundation.

- 14. The inundation of 1918 was one of the lowest on record. The prominent feature of the year was the unusually high river at the commencement of the season giving promise of a very favourable inundation, which, however, failed to be realized.
- The river commenced to rise in June and reached a height of 11.8 feet, the maximum level of the year, on the 19th June. From 20th June to 30th August there were extraordinary fluctuations, the river falling to 72 on the 28th July, then again rising to 11'1 on the 30th August, after which it fell steadily without recovering. The "fair irrigating level" of 13 feet at Bukkur was never reached this year, whereas this level was attained for 30 days in 1917, for 9 days in 1916 and for 13 days the average of the previous triennium. The "fair itrigating level" of 17 feet on the Kotri gauge was first recorded on the 2nd June, and the maximum level for the year of 19.5 feet on the 23rd June. The level of 17 feet and over was maintained (up to 1st July and again from 20th to 26th July and 7th and 8th September or a total of 39 days against 73 in 1917, 86 in 1916 and 75 days, the average of the previous three years.
- 16. The highest readings for the year were 11.8 feet on the Bukkur gauge on the 10th June and 19.5 feet on the Kotri gauge on the 23rd June as compared with 15.8 feet and 230 feet, respectively, in 1917, and the recorded maxima readings on these two gauges of 17'9 feet and 23'8 feet, respectively.

- 17. The rainfall for the year was negligible and its absence at a time when it was most urgently required contributed to the generally inferior crop results of the year. Rotations where regulators permitted did much to improve conditions and to emphasize the need for the construction of these most valuable aids to the control and distribution of the water supply. Taking Sind as a whole the crops which suffered most were cereals, these both in area and yield being much below the normal; but cotton did generally very well, the area if below the average being more than compensated for by the extraordinary good yield and the high market prices obtained. Conspicuous examples of this are the two Jamrao Districts where the crop was nearly a record in area and a bumper one in yield.
- 18. Mention cannot be omitted of the appalling visitation of Influenza which swept through Sind in the autumn and closing months of the year. The mortality was so great as to bring to a standstill all late harvesting operations and considerably retarded rabi preparations. The financial loss to the zamindars from this cause must have been very great.

#### 2.—INDUS RIGHT BANK DIVISION.

Desert Canal.

Rainfall

- (1) WORKS FOR WHICH CAPITAL AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEFT.
- 19. The canal was opened on 1st June as usual and ceased to flow on 13th October 1918, while in 1917 it ceased to flow on 25th November.
- 20. The supply of the canal from the feeder dhand was adversely affected during the season on account of excessive escape of water to the river through a bye-channel abovethe point of take-off. Several attempts were made to close this bye-channel, but owing to the high velocity and the sandy nature of the bed the work could not be carried out. Ultimately when the river fell, the attempt proved successful. The first bund has since been consolidated and two others built in addition so as to guard against any failure. The closing of this channel has been of inestimable benefit to the Desert Canal and has saved the

situation in regard to the growing of fodder crops. The canal was again opened on 11th February 1919, and has been flowing uninterruptedly ever since. This has been of great assistance to the zamindars as the early fall in the river in October practically cut off the rabi supply on wluch this canal depends to a great extent, particularly in the tracts of lands at the tail where the soil is hard and kalarish.

21. The full supply gauge reading of 10 feet was never obtained. The highest reading recorded was 7.9 on 28th August 1918. Full supply of 2,750 cusecs was obtained on 12 days.

22. Adiowah.—Owing to the low river and the fact that the bed of the canal is at a high level, it worked very badly and relief had to be given to zamindars as far as possible by allowing them to take water temporarily from the Desert Canal. The work for remodelling this canal has been completed.

- 23. The canal was opened on 11th June 1918 and it flowed for 89 days.
- 24. The canal was opened on 1st June and ceased to flow on 26th September. It Unharmab. worked satisfactority up to 24th June, but there was not much demand for water. Early in July owing to the fall of the river, rotations were started and were continued from time to time till end of September when the canal stopped flowing. Full supply gauge reading of 10 feet was never attained owing to low inundation and the designed discharge of 1,675 cusecs was obtained on 14 days.
- 25. The canal was opened on 1st June as usual and finally ceased to flow on 21st Began Canal. October 1918. There being no demand, the water was regulated at all the four regulators from the start.
- 26 Subsequently, as the demand increased, all the regulators were cleared of needles by 24th June. The supply in the canal due to the fall in the river, being unequal to the demand, rotations were enforced from 29th June. The river being low during July and the first fortnight of August rotations were continued generally. Then from the middle of August to about 10th of September, the canal was flowing free due to a comparatively good supply. After the latter date an attempt was made to restart the rotations but the water in the river and the canal fell rapidly and it was not possible to maintain the required water level at the different regulators to give full supply to the branch canals.
- 27. A scourhole  $50 \times 40 \times 6$  feet developed in the down stream pavement of the 38th mile regulator and was first observed on 27th July, when the necessary steps were taken to deal with it. The rotations had to be altered so as to carry out the repairs. On the whole, the upper portion of the Begari did well, but there was some deficiency at the tail, particularly in the Eden and Sirwahs.
- 28. The Choi Branch worked fairly well. Though there was much deficiency of water during the season, especially during July and August, the kharif crop was as good as usual. Rice cultivation has increased a good deal. It probably amounts to nearly 50 per cent. more than the previous year. The reason for this is attributed to the fact that the zamindars planted more rice owing to the jowari crop in 1917 having been damaged by heavy rains. When they found that the supply was deficient by the middle of July, they took to jowari and bajri which were saved by timely rotations.
- 29. The work of additions and alterations to the head sluices over distributaries ex: Choi carried out during the last working season had some effect in reducing silting in the distributaries.
- 30. The Mahiwah was opened on the 7th June 1918. The river cut into the Guddu Mahiwah. Dhand at its 16th mile (from the mouth of the Mahiwah) and delivered a fairly good supply of water. With the exception of Masu and Maharowah, which received a poor supply, all the canals under the Mahiwah system did fairly well, considering the low level of the river, and the crops were fairly good throughout. Certain improvements were carried out last year to the Deharwah with the result that the canal worked most successfully. The area under kharif cultivation has increased all along its length. Even the crops at its tail were reported to be exceptionally good and fields not brought under the plough for years have been cultivated this year.
- 31. The Seharwah was opened on the 6th June 1918 and worked fairly well and the water supply was nearly sufficient for the area under cultivation.
- 32. The Sukkur canal was opened on 13th June and ceased flowing on 14th September Sukkur Canal.
  1918. Owing to the low river the supply was deficient throughout the season all along the
  canal and branches. The dhoro which feeds the canal worked satisfactorily. The groynes
  constructed in the past two years kept it clear of silt. The old head of the canal used for
  rabi supply had to be opened on 14th September to enable the kharif crops to mature.
- 33. Clearance was done at the tails of Kurs Khairo and Biro, the upper portion of Kur Maksudo and the whole of the Napat Sukkur Canal. The pavement of the head regulator of the Napat Sukkur was lowered by one foot and clearance done to that level. This was of immense benefit to that canal.
- 34. The work of strengthening the Ghanghra cross regulator in the 40th mile of the canal and the head regulators of the two branches Kur Khairo and Kur Biro, which take off just above the cross regulator, was undertaken during the year. This has been done to enable more water to be headed up at the Ghanghra regulator for the benefit of the above

two branches, at the tail of which there is always deficiency. The pavement of the Ghanghra regulator has also been raised by 1½ feet. This, together with the reduction of such of the sluices as carry away excessive water, will materially help the tail of Sukkur Canal, and the tails of Kur Biro and Kur Kbairo.

Glar Casal

- 35. The Ghar Canal was opened on 25th May as usual. The date fixed by the Commissioner for opening is 15th May, but cultivators are never ready to take water so early. Even on 25th May, there was no consumption of water with the result that too much water accumulated at the tail south of Nasirabad. This excess of water only ceased when zamindars began opening their karias in the beginning of June. The canal bad a fair supply throughout the season and considering the very low river during the year, the Ghar may be said to have worked very satisfactorily. It takes its supply from the Ghar Dhand exthe river. In July a low island was formed by the river in front of the dhand mouth, which prejudicially affected the supply in the canal, but by the end of August, the island moved lower down and the mouth was clear. The dam that was constructed in 1916-1917 across the dhand below the take-off of the Ghar stood well during the whole inundation and very materially helped the supply in the canal. The canal ceased to flow on the 18th October 1918.
- 36. The Fordwah supplements the water supply to the Ghar about the middle of its length. It worked satisfactorily throughout the season.
- 37. The Naurangwah is one of the two main branches at the tail of the Ghar. It used to silt considerably at the head, and heavy silt clearance was annually carried out. Last year no clearance was done, but the first two miles were groyned on both sides to reduce the width. This has had the effect of scouring the silt from the middle while the sides are silting up. It is hoped that no further clearance will be necessary in future. The Naurang bifurcates into the Gath and Chilo and these will have to be widened sufficiently to take off the surplus water from Naurang and thus improve the deficiency at the tails. At present the water heads up in the Naurang endangering its banks, and sufficient water even when available cannot be admitted for fear of breaches in this canal though there is a demand for water lower down.
- 38. The Nurwah, the othermain branch at the tail of the Ghar, has been scouring its bed and sides for some years past and is now taking much more than its fair share. During the last two years the bed and sides have been protected by bed groynes of date logs to prevent further scour.
- 39. The Nasrat Canal, which was formerly a branch of the Ghar, now takes off from the Ghar Dhand. Owing to the low river the supply in the canal was deficient, but its working was satisfactory. The pavement of the head regulator was again damaged during the year (when water was cut off at the beginning of the season) by water finding its way under the pavement from below the foundations of the left wing wall. Fortunately it was not necessary to cut off water during the rest of the season. The damage is being repaired by demolishing the wing wall and its foundations and reconstructing it after filling the hollow with hydraulic lime concrete. (This has since been completed and the regulator now works well.) A very bad bend in the 2nd mile just below the railway bridge has been removed and the canal flows better now.

witch Coool.

- 40. The supply in the Suttah Canal was not so unsatisfactory this year as was expected on account of the low inundation. The canal first flowed on the 25th of May with 5 fees of water at the head regulator when Kotri read 15'8. Full supply level of the canal is to feet; the average readings of the downstream regulator for the abkalani months show very fair results.
- 41. The downstream pavement and pitching of many karia heads was extended since, with the excessive velocity through the gates, the original length was far too small.
  - (ii) WORRS FOR WHICE ONLY REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE REFT.
- 42. The principal canals under this head are the Sind, Western Nara, Pinyari, Kalri and Baghar canals.

Red Cook

43. The Sind canal was opened on the 2nd June 1918. Owing to the low level of the river it did not flow with its full supply during the whole of the abkalani. Colonel Fife's Channel, however, worked satisfactorily considering the low inundation. The old Sind canal head silted up badly owing to erosion at its head and failed to supply sufficient water, and so a cut 10 feet wide was excavated to supplement the supply at the end of July which greatly helped in flooding some area for rabi crops. The condition of crops was not good, Rise has done badly. The dry crop grown by lift is fairly good. Rabi was poor.

Western Name

- 44. This canal was opened on the 1st June 1918 with the gauge at Bukkur recording 107. The regulator at head was gradually opened to allow the new earthwork at last year's breaches to get slowly and well soaked. Full supply level was never obtained during the year. Taking all things into consideration the canal worked as well as could be expected under the most adverse circumstances. The canal stopped flowing on the 8th October 1918.
- 45. The New Feeder takes off from Kumbbrani Dhand ex: River Indus and joins the Western Nara at mile 33. Its main object is to supplement the supply in the main Nara, though it only does so to a very small extent. The canal was opened on the 24th June

1918 with the upstream and downstream gauges reading 10.7 and 9.3, respectively. The canal was not fully opened until the 1st August to allow the new earthwork at the large breaches of the last year to get well soaked. The canal ceased to flow on the 18th September 1918 when the gauge at Bukkur recorded 7.1.

- 46. The head regulator of the Pritchard canal, which is the second feeder of the Western Nara, was opened on 1st June and remained fully opened during the season except from 8th to 35th June, when so much water was not yet wanted. It attained a maximum gauge reading of 95, 82 on the 1st regulator and 80 on the 2nd regulator on the 25th June. But the maximum reading during the months of July and August was only 75 feet on the 1st regulator and 72 feet on the 2nd regulator against 10 feet full supply level. The stop gate regulator at mile 20/2 was also partially closed once a week in August for the benefit of the Kudan tail. The canal finally ceased flowing on the 26th October.
- 47. Again during the year under report rotations at the intermediate regulators on the Fiapan Causa. Pinyari proved most beneficial and in spite of the low inundation the results are not so bad as they might have been. Rotation by karias was also resorted to, and the reduction of karia openings completed during the previous season proved beneficial. Full supply level was reached at the head regulator on the 17th May, but the canal had to be closed as there was little demand for water. The upstream gauge of the head regulator gave readings higher than the F. S. L. up to the 29th of June and had zamindars arranged for early sowing of seedlings either in the very low lands or by lift irrigation, transplantation in practically all the low lands could have been completed before the river level fell.
- 48. This canal was opened on 17th May 1918. The tail branches and karias at the tail Kalvi Canal. of Kalri during the average inundation year generally get an insufficient supply, but this year when the river was very low for the greater part of the year, the tail branches did not do so badly. This was due to the failure of karias in the upper reaches. As the lands in the upper reaches could not be watered the karias commanding them silted, with the result that a greater volume of water than usual went down to the tail, where the crops were not quite a failure.
- 49. Like the Pinyari on the left bank of the river the Baghar on the right bank first Baghar Casel. flowed late in March. During past high inundation years, when the Baghar has had an abundant supply of water at high level, a considerable extent of lift areas has been converted into flow cultivation so that during a low inundation zamindars are not prepared to return to expensive lift arrangements and in consequence the outturn of crops in such a season is very much less than it should be. Again, during a high inundation year there is always the danger of breaches in the banks which makes it very difficult for the zamindars to adopt expensive methods of irrigation when there is no certainty of even a fair result.

50. The following are principal original works under this head which were either com Unfinished works, menced during the previous year or during the year under report but were yet in progress.

#### 3.-INDUS LEFT BANK DIVISION.

#### (i) WORKS FOR WHICH CAPITAL AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

- 51. The canals in the Left Bank Division fall under two groups, vis., (a) the Eastern Nara System and (b) canals taking off direct from the Indus.
- 52. Under (a) are the Nara river, the Jamrao, Mithrao, Khipro, Thar and Hiral canals, of which the Khipro canal flows during the inundation only, the others being perennial. The Thar, though classed as perennial, is closed on or about the 1st December each year to save the country round about from being water-logged.
- 53. Under (b) are the Dad, Nasrat, Fuleli, Hassanali and a large number of smaller canals, all being classed as inundation canals though the Fuleli receives a fair rabi supply

#### (a) Canals taking off from the Eastern Nara.

#### Naro Supply Changel.

- 54. The Nara Supply Channel is an artificial channel, 12 miles in length, taking off the river on its left bank above Rohri and forming the mouth of the Nara, an ancient course of the Indus. The supply channel worked satisfactorily during the year and the necessity for the services of a dredger was not felt. The minimum discharge recorded during the year was 805 cusecs with a downstream reading of 7.7 feet at the head regulator. The head regulator was kept open throughout the inundation season to prevent silting at the head. Owing to the low inundation the 'sangs' along the length of the Nara were not replenished and the supply during the cold weather was consequently below the normal.
- 55. Necessary repairs to the channel and its sides consisting of stone pitching and groyningwere carried out during the year. Stone groynes were constructed in miles 8 and 9 where erosion had occurred to the sides in order to reduce the channel to its proper width and to prevent silt depositing in the centre of the channel.
- 56. An expenditure of Rs 40,142 was incurred on the payment of land compensation for the Flood Diversion Bund. The total expenditure on this project amounted to Rs. 4,23,332.

The Nara.

- 57. The Nara from the end of the Nara Supply Channel to the Jamrao is about 96 miles and from the Jamrao to the Thar Weir about 100 miles in length. It commands over 5,00,000 acres of cultivable land. The area cultivated during the year on the Nara in the Eastern Nara District was about 34,609 acres as against 35,046 acres in 1917-18 and 38,581 acres, the average of the previous three years.
- 58. The Nara bed is in very fair condition. Owing to the extraordinary low level of the river there was no surplus water to pass through the Mooral and Bagdad (sluices) for storage in the Makhi dhand, the reservoir for supplementing the rabi supply to the Mithrao. As stated in the last year's report, the head of the right bank distributary of the Makhi Distributaries project has been taken off from the Mithrao above the Bakhora regulator and the Makhi dhand has been retained as a reservoir for augmenting the rabi supply to the Mithrao.

Jameso Canal.

- 59. The capital expenditure on the Jamrao canal during the year was Rs, 13,160 and was incurred on (1) extension of Bhitaro minor, (2) constructing distributary ex: 12th mile Digri minor and (3) distributary ex: 113th mile Jamrao canal. The recoveries of the year from colonists amounted to Rs. 1,981.
- 60. Current repairs to the head works were carried out as usual and they were maintained in good order throughout the year and were not subjected to any undue strain as the maximum and average discharge passing down the Nara were both low.
- 61. The area cultivated during the year was 2,30,667 acres as compared with 2,38,406 acres of the last year and 2,51,989 acres, the average of the previous three years. The area under cotton was about 1,18,841 acres as compared with 96,661 acres in the last year and 83,920 acres, the average of the previous three years. The crop was nearly a record one and a bumper one in yield and with the high market price the zamindars have made large profits. There was, however, an appreciable decline in the area under rabi and this was due partly to the appalling visitation of Influenza which retarded cultivation operations and partly to the moderate supply available and the high price of cotton which tempted the zamindars to water cotton to a late date at the expense of wheat.
- 62. An allotment of new land to the extent of 2,874 acres was made during the year on this canal.

Mithrao Canal.

- 63. The supply in the Mithrao canal was fairly good at the commencement of the season, but after the middle of July continued to decrease and called for rotation at regulators along its length to save the situation. The absence of rain and the sudden fall of the river affected the rice crop. Some deficiency was felt in the 30th mile Left Bank distributary at the tail. The Left Bank branch and the 30th mile Right Bank distributary, including Samaro branch, did not work satisfactorily owing to silting on account of constant fluctuations in the water level. The construction of the 30th and 45th mile distributaries and the reduction in sizes of karias between miles 16 and 30 of the main canal have improved water supply conditions in the lower reaches of the Mithrao to some extent and the completion of the Makhi distributaries now under construction will do a good deal more. The Makhi distributary left with the Chotiari minor have been completed and opened in 1919, while the Makhi distributary right will come into operation in 1920.
- 64. The capital expenditure of the year amounted to Rs. 55,503 and was incurred in constructing the Makhi distributaries right and left.
- 65. The area cultivated during the year under report was 108,751 acres as compared with 116,455 acres in the last year and 124,403 acres, the average of the previous three-vears.

- 66. The Hiral Canal was opened on 8th April and worked satisfactorily on the whole. Hiral Canal. The canal was designed for the cultivation of dry crops only and rice is entirely prohibited. But owing to the declining prosperity of the tract in the past this restriction was relaxed and the zamindars have been allowed to grow rice for another three years in low-lying and water-logged lands and also in high lift irrigated katar lands in which dry crops cannot at present be successfully grown. The project for the improvement of the Hiral tract was sanctioned during the year and the work was in progress.
- 67. The Hiral tract commands 49,000 acres of cultivable land. The cultivation during the year was 12,395 acres as compared with 10,118 acres in the last year and 15,005 acres, the average of the previous three years.
- 68. The capital expenditure during the year amounted to Rs. 40,627 and was incurred on constructing the Head distributary ex: Hiral Canal.
- 69. An allotment of new land to the extent of 251 acres was made to the local zamindars on the canal during the year, while 135 acres of fallow forfeited area were restored to the zamindars.
- 70. The Thar Canal and its branches worked satisfactorily. As the river was low Thar Canal throughout the season, the canal did not get its full supply of 8.7 feet and rotations had to be resorted to at the intermediate regulators for the proper distribution of water.
  - 71. The cultivation on this canal during the year was about 53,811 acres against 52,640 acres in the last year and 57,942 acres, the average of the three previous years.
  - 72. The project for two distributaries ex: the 3rd mile (right) and 7th mile (left bank) designed to economise the present extravagant supply of water now obtained direct from the main canal through low-lying karias between miles 3 to 8 on the right and 7 to 13 on the left bank was sanctioned during the year under report and good progress was made with its construction. The capital outlay on the distributaries during the year amounted to Rs. 22,220. They should do much to remove the complaint of deficiency in the lower reaches of the Thar Canal which has been a grievance crying for redress for years past.
  - 73. The Khipro Canal commenced flowing on the 19th May 1918 and ceased to flow Khipro Canal. on 20th September. Owing to the very low inundation, the supply was below normal throughout the season.
  - 74. The cultivation on this canal during the year was about 2,553 acres against 2,842 acres in the last year and 3,797 acres, the average of the previous three years.

#### (b) Canals taking off direct from the Indus.

- 75. On the whole the Nasrat Canal obtained a fair supply throughout the season. Nasrat Canal. The supply was very good till about the end of June but thereafter the abnormally low river necessitated the adoption of rotations for the distribution of available supply.
- 76. The groynes, which were constructed last year in the Lundi Dhand and proved so beneficial, were extended and raised during the year, canalizing the irregular section of the Lundi Dhand and reducing its width to 90 feet up to, and 75 feet below, the Mehrabwah head. These groynes have reduced silting in the Dhand to a minimum and it is expected will maintain this satisfactory condition unless the head of the Dhand is crossed at any time by floods from the direction of Khairpur State.
- 77. The reduction of sluices above mile 36 and between miles 51 and 72 gave an improved supply to the tail. The cultivation during the year on this canal was about 68,283 acres against 77,878 in the last year and 87,340 acres, the average of the three previous years. The decrease was due to less cultivation under juari and bajri, the area under cotton remaining normal.
- 78. The total expenditure on the construction of karias and kasis up to the end of the year on the canal amounted to Rs. 2,88,860.
  - 79. An allotment of 8 acres was made on this canal to Junior Talpurs during the year.
- 80. The canal was opened on the 20th of May and ceased flowing on the 3rd of Dad Canal. November. The supply was sufficient throughout the season in spite of the inundation being one of the lowest on record. This was due to the fact that its feeder, which had been scoured out to about 3' below its designed bed two ears ago, maintained its deep channel and kept free of silt. This success was due to the extensive groyning which was done to the sides thereby reducing its width previously varying from 100 to 200 feet to a uniform 100 feet and so canalizing the channel. The banks of the canal in miles 78 to 81 which usually breach and those of the feeder and other canals which were too low were raised and strengthened during the year.
- 81. The groynes in the bed which were constructed last year below the 50th mile to raise the water level to improve the supply to the branch canal, the Mubarak, and to restrict flooding at the tail of the Dad, were extended and raised with some further small improvements on existing conditions, but no really satisfactory and permanent results can be obtained particularly with regard to the flooding at the tail of the canal until the Lower Dad Remodelling Project is undertaken.

- 82. The cultivation during the year was 64,105 acres against 121,439 acres in the last year and 112,047 acres, the average of the three previous years.
- 83. The total expenditure on the construction of karias and kasis to the end of the year under report amounted to Rs. 1,32,574.
- 84. New land to the extent of 7 acres was allotted during the year in extension of holdings to local zamindars.
- 85. The Ren Distributary is fed by the Dad Canal and worked satisfactorily in spite of the low inundation as the Dad Feeder brought in a good supply throughout the season. The total expenditure on this project to end of year under report was Rs. 2,13,819.
  - 86. New land to the extent of 1,921 acres was allotted on this canal.

Fuleli Canal.

- 87. The Fuleli Canal on the whole worked satisfactorily. Rotations were frequently resorted to and these saved the situation to a great extent.
- 88. The dhand supplying the new cut to the old Fuleli excavated in 1917 was heavily silted towards the end of the inundation. Active erosion of the river, however, took place at its tail and carried away its most heavily silted portion. As erosion still continues, no special measures have been adopted. Silt clearance was carried out in a length of about half a mile near the Nareja regulator and a length of half a mile below the regulator was reduced by single groynes so as to canalize that portion which is very wide and silts.
- 89. The new mouth to the Dokiawah above the Alipur regulator worked very satisfactorily. It was kept open in the rabi season and several zamindars took advantage of the rabi supply available.
- 90. The area cultivated during the year was about 371,500 acres against 386,780 acres in the last year and 416,190 acres the average of the three previous years.
- 91. The capital expenditure on this canal during the year under report was Rs. 13,896 and was incurred on new mouth to the Dokiawah above the Alipur regulator.

Hassanali Canal.

- 92. The main Hassanali Canal and its branches worked satisfactorily on the whole.
- 93. The area under cultivation was about 18,000 acres against 18,955 acres cultivated in the last year and 18,967 acres, the average of the three previous years.

Canals in the Hyderab.ad Canals District.

- 94. With the exception of Sarfrazwah all the canals in this District worked satisfactorily. Owing to the low inundation the Great Marak Canal gave no trouble this year. The construction of a regulator over this canal is in progress.
- 95. The cultivation this year in the whole of the Hyderabad Canals District was about 260,000 acres against 287,827 acres in the last year and 280,031 acres, the average of the three previous years.
  - (ii) Works for which only Revenue Accounts are kept.
- 96. The principal canals under this head are Naulakhi, Mehrab and Dhambro in the Nasrat Canals District and Ren, Gharo Mahmudo, Kari Shumali and Nasir in the Hyderabad Canals District. All the canals under this head, with the exception of Nasir, obtained a fairly good supply. The Naulakhi Canal was fed from both 1915 and 1917 heads. The 1917 head was opened later in order to avoid breaches lower down as the canal is not provided with a Regulator. It is very necessary to provide Head Regulators over this canal and on the Mehrabwah and the matter is in hand.

#### 4.—PROTECTIVE EMBANKMENTS.

- 97. The maximum gauge reading at Bukkur was 11.8 against 15.8 in the previous year The inundation was very poor and the Kashmor bund was not put to any severe test.
- 98. In the first section the flood water touched the whole of the front bund, 1896 loop, Tori bund, and Haibat loop up to the 16th mile, while in the second and third sections the flood water did not touch the bund at all.
- 99. Erosion took place at Begari mouth in ordinates 3/6 and 4/1 and the maximum of 200 feet in a week was along the ordinate at 3/6 mile. The front bund remained intact but the river at the nearest point was only 250 feet away. Once this bund goes the 1896 loop becomes the first line of defence.
- 100. There were no leaks or breaches of any importance this year. All minor leaks and breaches were promptly detected and closed by the establishment.
  - 101. Tori, Haibat and Ghouspur bunds were thoroughly wetted by the trench system.
- 102. The system of river bunds in the Western Nara District is 101 miles in length. During the year under report the river spill only touched these bunds at the beginning of season at some places. There were no leaks or breaches during the year. The question of closing the gap or constructing a loop to the Manjhand Bund System has been abandoned. The other portion of this bund was not severely tested as there was very little water against it. The water touched the Phulu Bund in the beginning of abkalani at various places, but it stood the pressure very well.

- 103. In the Ghar Canals District as the set of the river is towards the left bank and as the inundation was low, there was no water against the bunds except at some local depressions. The bunds were kept in order by removing grass and jungle from top and slopes and putting earth on the portions worn away, but no wetting was done as water did not touch the bund.
- 104. In the Shikarpur Canals District the bunds were not severely tested owing to low level of the river.
- 105. In the Karáchi Canals District the free board along the bund line during the year under report on account of the low inundation, was adequate, but in a few places along the Baghar Uchito Bund slight raising is necessary which has been ascertained after recent levelling. It has also been found necessary to bring the same bund to standard section.
- 106. A breach occurred at mile 20/4 of the Baghar Uchito Bund on the 9th June 1918. The position of the breach was at a dangerous part of the bund and where a sluice, which was under construction, had not been completed. The breach was closed on the 16th June 1918. The damage done to crops due to this breach was not considerable.
- 107. Owing to the low river, water only touched small lengths of the bunds in the Left Bank Division. All bunds kept intact and gave no trouble. In the Fuleli District the stone pitching to Gidu Bunder bund was badly displaced. This was repaired in time and about 10,000 cubic feet of reserve stone was thrown in at the toe, wherever slips were observed. This is a makeshift measure and much more extensive efforts, now under consideration, are needed to make this portion of the bund safe.
- 108. The project for the construction of a river protective bund between Herbertwah and Gharo Alibahar to prevent spill water flooding the tract below Daulatpur and Sakrand is in hand and will shortly be ready for submission to the Indus River Commission.

#### 5.-INDUS RIVER COMMISSION.

109. The expenditure on works and surveys was charged to "43-Irrigation Minor Indus River Works and Navigation-Agricultural Works-Works for which neither Capital nor Revenue Commission Works Accounts are kept."

- 110. The usual topographical surveys, aggregating 1,958 miles in length, of the Indus, Surveys of the Indus. dhands, bunds, etc., were carried out. The total length of the river course from Rojhan in the Punjab to the point of its bifurcation was 549 miles. About 503 miles of this length together with 26 miles of the Haideri river and 5 miles of the Ochito were surveyed and plotted.
- III. The Khairpur boundary rails were inspected as usual. The demarcation of the Khairpur Boundary rails and Bahawalpur State has been completed boundary between Sind and Bahawalpur State has been completed, State Boundary demorcation.
- 112. Gauge readings of the river were taken daily at 11 stations, twice a week at 4 River Gauges. stations and weekly at 9 stations.

113. Discharge observations were continued at Sukkur and Kotri and observations of Scientific works and other kinds were also made as usual. The results will be published in the Indus River discharges of the Records. The discharge at Sukkur during the inundation and the minimum discharge of the year, compared with the results of previous four years, are as follow :-

114. The discharge observations of the Indus at Mithankot during the cold weather above and below the junction with the Chenab were continued. The minimum discharge was 19,680 and 31,898 cusecs respectively at the two sites.

116. The large expenditure shown against the Karáchi Canals District was required for the construction of new Belo and Marho loops. The old bunds were threatened during the past inundation season. The Belo Bund was actually eroded towards the end of the season while the Marho Bund will only just avoid erosion during the current inundation. No loss either to property or cultivation occurred owing to the erosion of the Belo Bund during the past inundation as the river was not very high.

Maintenance and Repairs. 117. The total expenditure under this head on the several works under the direct control of the Indus River Commission was Rs. 15,166 of which Rs. 3,039 were spent on the river gauge establishments at Sukkur, Kotri, Jerruck and the Indus Delta.

Snagging operations.

119. No snagging and clearance work was carried out as the dredger "Mudlark" was sent to Mesopotamia.

Erosion.

- 120. Heavy erosion occurred at mile 4/1 of Kashmor Bund, 12/5 and 28/0 of Sukkur Begari Bund, 100/0 of Western Nara Bund and 33/6 of the Mulchand Shahbunder Bund, the maximum rate of erosion being 280, 365, 300, 508 and 444 feet per week respectively.
- 121. The erosion between miles 32/0 to 34/2 of Mulchand Shahbunder Bund and 5/4 to 6/2 of Baghar Uchito Bund necessitated the construction of the Belo and Marho loops noted above.
- 122. The bend forming at Belo is becoming far more marked and the set of the river opposite the Marho loop bund is normal to the bund line. The erosion at the latter place has averaged over 40 feet per week during the present inundation and at times lengths of over 100 feet have been eroded in the case of individual ordinates. This erosion is considered heavy.

Sukkur Barrage.

123. The surveys in connection with the Barrage Project have been practically completed and the preparation of the plans and estimates is in hand. It is hoped shortly to submit the Barrage plans and estimates and a greatly increased staff is now employed on the preparation of the designs and estimates for the canals. The soil survey has been completed.

#### 6.-MISCELLANEOUS.

Plantations.

124. The existing plantations on canals and along bunds in the Left Bank Division have been well cared for. New trees have been planted in all districts along the various canals and ounds and they are generally doing well.

125. No Egyptian cotton was grown in this Division.

#### III.—DECCAN AND GUJARA'T.

#### 1.-NORTHERN DIVISION.

127. The rainfall during the year 1918-1919 was from the very beginning of the mon-General romarks. soon not only deficient but also very badly distributed, and consequently there was wide-spread failure of the whole cultivation except the crops that were irrigated. The flood in the Hathmati River helped to relieve the situation to some extent, but it was aggravated by Influenza which spread practically throughout the whole length and breadth of the country and greatly delayed agricultural operations owing to the consequent scarcity of labour.

#### (i) FIBST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

- 128. The rainfall gauged at Ahmedabad and Prántij was 9:36 inches and 7:13 inches Hathmati and only against an average of 29:40 and 30:47 inches, respectively, for the last 30 years. There Khari Cut Canals. was in consequence a total failure of food grains and other crops and scarcity prevailed over Northern Gujarát, though not actual famine except in some parts of the Panch Maháls.
- 129. The monsoon made its appearance on the 31st May and about 1 to 1½ inches of rain fell at several stations on the Hathmati and Khari Cut Canals on that day and the next. Then it disappeared until the last day of June when it rained 1 to 2 inches. In July and August there were only drizzles at intervals, but on the 30th and 31st August it poured heavily from 2 to 6 inches at different places, and at Hadol in the Ahmedabad Collectorate the rainfall measured 12 inches. The next three days it drizzled measuring a few cents only and then it ceased altogether and the monsoon ended.
- 130. Owing to heavy showers all round and especially on the Abu side on the 30th and 31st August, both the Hathmati and Sabarmati rivers were flooded. The flood water of the Hathmati was diverted into the Bokh Reservoir filling it to 100 m.cft. One watering was given from this to about 150 acres of the bajri crop and 50 acres of sugarcane crop, using up about 70 m.cft. The remaining 30 m.cft. were used in filling up the Ashlali Gam and Naroda Gam Tanks and in the last watering of the rice fields. Due to further fall of rain, the cultivators raised juwari and bajri crops in their fields all along the canal line. It then became a very serious question to protect all the crops which required watering simultaneously all around, but with careful distribution about 800 acres were protected, every cultivator having been given the chance to irrigate some part of his fields. In this way fodder was secured for cattle, mitigating in a small way the fodder famine and giving employment to labour. Almost all village tanks along the canal line were filled for domestic purposes. Water was not available in a sufficient quantity for rabi, but what was available was given in rotation and about 259 acres were irrigated.
- 131. The discharge in the Khari Cut, which measured 31 cusecs after the first rainfall, was utilized in irrigating the hot weather crop over 830 acres upto the end of June. It was then diverted into the Chandola Tank, the water level in which rose from R. L. 131 to R. L. 132. On the 30th August, due to heavy rains, there was a flood in the Khari, which was allowed down the river. The water, however, having been absorbed on the way, never reached Pinglaj. On the 3rd September it was turned into the Chandola Tank, raising its level to 13420 and storing 34 m.cft. This Chandola water was distributed to transplant rice over 30 acres of Kiari in the bagayat land of Dani Limda, but the outturn was about 6 annas in a rupee, as the transplantation was late and sufficient moisture was not left in the ground. Besides rice crops, the canal water was utilized in irrigating 400 acres of juwari crop and 50 acres of sugarcane crop.
- 132. As almost all monsoon days were dry, very little kharif crop was grown on rain during the year under report.

133. The area irrigated and the gross assessed revenue compare with the average for the triennium ending 1917-1918 as under:—

135. The Tranza-Nagrama Tank did not fill at all, but the Wangroli, Savli and Saiat Tanks filled partially, and the water was utilized in raising some kharif and hot weather crops. Due to scanty rainfall the cultivators were obliged to take water for rice and fodder crops and there was an increase in the kharif irrigation on these tanks. All these tanks were maintained in good condition at a cost of Rs. 12,151. Special repairs to Saiat Tank and Wangroli Tank Canals were carried out at a total cost of Rs. 497 and 504 respectively.

Futelao Tank.

- 136. The Futelao Tank did not fill and with the little water it received about 18 acres of land was irrigated in kharif which yielded a revenue of Rs. 35 against 45 acres and a revenue of Rs. 90 of the last year. The yield from cultivation in its bed was Rs. 107 against Rs. 160 during the previous year. The tank was maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 1,227.
  - (ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS AND AGRICULTURAL WORKS.

Khari sluices.

137. The rainfall of the 30th June in the catchment round about Himatnagar increased the discharge at Raipur from 17 cusecs to 60 cusecs, which was all let down to the Khari Sluices for eight days but did not reach even Lali on account of absorption on the way, and to prevent such waste the water had to be taken into the Khari Cut and allowed to pass into the Chandola Tank. Thus on Khari Sluices no cultivation was done as the Khari did not flow at all during the whole season. The overflow of the Sabarmati River, however, flooded the Naika and some of Chanindra lands and the people of these villages cultivated some juwari.

Muwalia Tank.

138. The rainfall gauged at Muwalia was 11.28 inches, which was much below the average. The tank, however, had, due to the heavy rains of 1917, some storage left over from the previous year which helped much in irrigating the kharif crop as well as the hot weather crops. The kharif irrigation showed a marked increase as compared with the last three years, while there being scarcity of rain during the year under report, the rabi irrigation decreased. The total irrigation in the year is greater than that in the past three years, the area irrigated being 724 acres and the revenue Rs. 2,030. The miscellaneous receipts derived from the cultivation, etc., in the tank bed were, in addition, Rs. 289 against Rs. 348 last year. The tank and the canals were maintained in good condition at a cost of Rs. 2,936 and the total revenue was Rs. 2,310.

Old tanks.

139. Improvements to 63 and repairs to 51 small irrigation tanks in the Gujarát Irrigation District and repairs to 24 tanks in the Surat and Broach District were executed at a otal cost of Rs. 50,096 and Rs. 32,133 respectively.

Drainage Channels.

140. The drainage channels in the Surat and Broach and Gujarát Irrigation District's were maintained at a cost of Rs. 5,082 and Rs. 7,321 respectively and the reclamation works in the former at a cost of Rs. 3,411.

141. The following works were in progress during the year :-

Works in progress

- (i) The Timba Tank at Harsol, taluka Prántij, Ahmedabad District;
- (ii) The Matewal Tank at Salun and Nanodra villages, taluka Thásra, Kaira District;
- (iii) The Fudsar Tank at Lasundra, taluka Kapadvanj, Kaira District;
- (iv) The Bodidra Bujrag Tank; and
- (v) The Tank at Dangaria, Táluka Godhra, Panch Maháls.

#### 2.—CENTRAL DIVISION.

- 142. In the Central Division there are few irrigation works of importance.
- 143. The year under report had very scanty rainfall throughout the Central Division and consequently there was insufficient replenishment in the tanks while the demand for canal water was very great.

#### (i) FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

- 144. The area irrigated under this tank was 4,804 acres against 2,250 acres, the average Ekruk Tank. of the previous three years and the gross assessed revenue amounted to Rs. 1,23,387, showing an increase of Rs. 3,4,885 over the average for the past triennium. The high increase was due mainly to the issue of water freely to non-lease-holders, especially for food and fodder crops owing to the general scarcity. It was also due in this and other cases to the unexpected and extraordinary demand for canal water that was experienced in both the monsoon and rabi seasons owing to the persistent holding off of the rains in July and August when water is most needed for the maturity of the monsoon crops.
- 145. The Agricultural Department has been making experiments on new methods of planting sugarcane on the Ekruk Canal, similar to those tried at the Manjri Farm in the Poona District. 50 acres were allowed to be grown with sugarcane for these experiments on payment of the usual water rate, by the owners who offered to try the new methods.
- 146. These canals form an important irrigation system in the East Khándesh District, Jamda Canals The eight months rabi leases introduced on these canals in October 1916 are now becoming more popular and receiving greater attention at the hands of the cultivators. The holding off of rains in the middle of July and August 1918 at a time when rain is most needed for the kharif crops, opened their eyes and made them seek the protection afforded by the canals and enter into the new system of leases. The result was that the area under the rabi leases increased by 323 acres, i. e., from 262 acres to 585, against the minimum estimated lease area of 1,000 acres. The most important requirement for making the Jamda canals remunerative independently is a separate storage reservoir. At present the Girna river discharge at the Jamda Bandhara is supplemented by a supply of water from the Chankapur tank, but it is not to be depended on permanently as it has its own large irrigated area to provide for.
- 147. All other works except the Mukti and the Koregaon Tanks showed an increase in Other works, area as compared with the average areas for the preceding triennium and it was due to the extraordinary demand for water owing to the failure of rains. The decrease under the Mukti Tank was due to insufficient storage in the tank, in consequence of which water had to be refused to many late applicants as it had to be reserved for the irrigators of Kayam Bagait lands and for those whose applications were received in time and accepted. The revenue under the tank was, however, greater due to unauthorised use of canal water for which double the prescribed rates were assessed. The fall in area under the Koregaon Tank was also due to insufficient storage, and water from the tank could not be issued to all the lease-holders to the full extent; there was consequently a fall in revenue from the tank.
- 148. The total area irrigated on all the first class irrigation works in this Division was 22,955 acres and the gross assessed revenue Rs. 2,22,366 as against 12,235 acres and Rs. 1,56,494 respectively, the averages of the previous triennium.
  - (ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.
- 149. The total expenditure on extensions and improvements and maintenance and repairs to the Bandharas in the East and West Khándesh Districts was Rs. 2,635.

#### 3.—DECCAN IRRIGATION DIVISION.

- (i) FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.
  - (a) Works in existence.

Protective Works.

- r50. Of the works in operation in the Deccan, the Nira Left Bank Canal, which is Nira Left Bank Situated in the Poona District, is the most important at present.

  Canal, and Shetphai Tank.
- 151. The total area irrigated under this canal during the year under review was 54,642 acres, the gross revenue from all sources being Rs. 6,40,550. These figures are much above the average, the increase being mainly due to the very high demand for water for rabi crops owing to the total failure of the rabi rains.

Mhaswad Tank.

152. The total area irrigated under the Mhaswad Tank, in the Sholápur District, was 9,577 acres and the gross revenue realised from all sources Rs. 57,161. The latter figure is much above the average, the increase being partly due to the failure of the monsoon and consequent high demand for water and partly to the revenue realised by letting out the land in the tank basin for cultivation.

Godavari Canals.

- 153. The Godavari Canals scheme comprises the following works:-
  - (1) Lake Beale Storage Reservoir.
  - (2) Pick-up-weir at Nandur Madhmeshwar.
  - (3) Godavari Right and Left Bank Canals.
- 154. Godavari Right Bank Canal.—The whole length of 70½ miles of the canal together with all its distributaries has been completed. The whole of the canal was in operation during the year and the area irrigated was 28,280 acres, the revenue realised from all sources being Rs. 3,04,950. The cultivation under irrigation has not yet been fully developed. This, except for sugarcane plantation, will take some time under normal rainfall conditions.
- 155. Godavari Left Bank Canal.—The whole length of 48 miles of this canal together with all its distributaries has also been completed. The canal was in operation during the year and the area irrigated was 17,614 acres, the revenue realised from all sources being Rs. 2,09,510.
- 156. The increase in areas irrigated under these two canals is due to the extension of rabi irrigation and the increase in revenue partly to the extension of rabi irrigation and partly to the enhancement of rates for sugarcane and other perennial crops.

#### Productive Works.

Mutha Canals and Matoba Tank. 157. The Mutha Canals system irrigated a total area of 17,662 acres, the gross revenue from all sources being Rs. 5,75,485 including Rs. 2,55,811 realised from the Poona Water Supply. The increase in area is due to the abnormal demand for rabi water owing to the total failure of the rabi rains. The proposal for the separation of the accounts of the Poona Water Supply from those of the Mutha Canals system was approved by the Government of India towards the close of the year and the necessary adjustments in the accounts were carried out.

#### (b) Works under construction.

#### Protective Works

Pravara Canals.

- 158. The Pravara Canals Irrigation Project comprises :-
  - (1) Lake Arthur Hill Storage,
  - (2) Pick-up-weir at Oihar.
  - (3) The Prayara Right and Left Bank Canals.
- 159. The total expenditure incurred during the year on this scheme was as under:-

- 160. Lake Arthur Hill Dam.—During the year under review, the masonry of the Dam throughout its length was raised from R.L. 2307 to R.L. 2333. A gap of 200 feet is left in the centre of the Dam at R.L. 2333 to allow the floods to pass through the central portion. Flank walls have been raised on both banks for about half the width of the Dam, 13 to 15 feet higher than the centre portion with cross-walls up to the downstream face.
- 161. The quantity of masonry done in the Dam during the year was about 12 lakhs of cubic feet against 7 lakhs done during the last year. This satisfactory result was due to the introduction of the scheme of selling cheap grain to the labour employed on the work. Owing to this arrangement there was a large influx of labour on the work, thus accelerating the progress of masonry and at the same time relieving the stress of famine in the neighbouring localities, where no famine works had to be opened.
- 162. The total quantity of the work carried out up to the end of March 1919 was about 74½ lakhs of cubic feet or about 56 per cent. of the total estimated masonry in the Dam. The Dam will probably be completed in 1923.
- 163. Sluices.—The third sluice at R.L. 2327.63 has been finished and the flank wall carried across over the same to join the rock cliff on the right bank. The pillars of the other two sluices have been raised to R.L. 2345.0 in level with the flank wall.

- 164. Waste weir.—The excavation was further extended during the year under report in soft materials for filling in the embankment on the low saddle. Excavation in hard rock was continued and the useful materials were utilised for the masonry of the two core walls and the Dam.
- 165. Flood embankment on old waste weir.—The masonry core wall has been in progress in full length and completed to the required height in a length of 500 feet at the east end. The remaining portion has been raised to an average height of 10 feet. The earthwork of the embankment has been in progress along the whole length and completed for about 400 feet.
- 166. The expenditure during the year on the masonry dam and other works was Rs. 4,30,969, the total expenditure on works only up to 31st March 1919 being about Rs. 34 lakhs. The estimated cost of the dam for works only is Rs. 54,91,730.
- 167. Pick-up weir at Ojhar.—The raising of the weir together with the construction of the Head Regulator with the scouring sluices for the Pravara Left Bank Canal have been completed.
- 168. Pravara Left Bank Canal.—The work of widening and extension of the old canal was started in 1910, and the earthwork and all the masonry works on the main canal are completed. Continuous progress on the construction of the distributary system is maintained and the canal will be ready in all respects for all classes of irrigation by the time an adequate supply of water is available from the Bhandardara Storage under construction.
- 169. Pravara Right Bank Canal.—All the works on this canal are completed including distributaries. The construction of the tail channel and the Rahuri Distributary is making satisfactory progress.
- 170. The canal was in operation upto mile 33, but the supply of water was inadequate and will remain so until water is available from "Lake Arthur Hill" at Bhandardara.
- 171. Chankapur Tank.—The supply in the Girna River was sufficient to meet the re-Girna River Works, quirements of the Girna Canal up to 2nd November 1918, when the tank was drawn up on for irrigation on the Girna River System and also for irrigation under Second Class works and Jamda Canals in the East Khándesh Pistrict.
- 172. Girna Left Bank Canal.—This canal irrigated during the year under report a total area of 4,495 acres and the gross revenue from all sources was Rs. 21,147. The large increase in the irrigated area is due to the very low rainfall during the year. The extension of this canal was in progress and the expenditure incurred thereon during the year was Rs. 15,513.
  - 173. The project comprises the following works:—

Nira Right Bank Canal.

- (1) Building a new Dam at Bhatghar.
- (2) Constructing a canal on the right bank from Vir upto Piliv for a length of about
- 174. Lake Whiting Dam.—The quantity of masonry laid during the year was about 18 lákhs of cubic feet. The total quantity carried out upto the end of March 1919 was about 561 lákhs of cubic feet or about 28 per cent. of the total estimated masonry in the dam. The dam will probably be completed in the year 1928.
- 175. Gunjawani Bridge.—The construction of the Gunjawani Bridge, which was started in 1917, was completed during the year under report.
- 176. Nira Right Bank Canal—Earthwork.—Embankment work in the whole length of the canal is very nearly completed except for the gaps left for the construction of masonry works.
- 177. Masonry Works.—Out of the total number of 20 aqueducts, 88 culverts and 38 road bridges on this canal, 1 aqueduct, 26 culverts and 11 road bridges have been completed to end of 1918-19. During the year under report 1 aqueduct, 8 culverts and 7 road bridges have been completed and 18 aqueducts, 34 culverts and 12 road bridges are in progress. The masonry works under D—Regulators have not yet been taken in hand. A number of permanent buildings required in connection with the project have already been constructed and a few are under construction.

179. On the whole, the progress on the various construction works in the Division General, is considered to be good in view of the unprecedented labour difficulties mainly due to the outbreak of Influenza and the unusual rise in the prices of food grains combined with a great scarcity of fodder.

180. Special Duty.—The officer placed by Government on special duty under the Deccan Irrigation Division completed, during the year under review, his investigations with regard to the future policy of irrigation in the Nira valley and also the re-investigation of the site for a large new dam adjacent to the site of the existing pick-up weir at Vir, which is 18 miles below the Bhatghar Dam on the Nira River.

#### (ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

181. During the year under report, the outlay on repairs, extensions and improvements to the Bandharas and small village channels was Rs. 19,459 as against Rs. 24,452 for the previous year.

#### ▲-SOUTHERN DIVISION.

#### (i) FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

182. The first class works in the Southern Division which are 15 in number irrigated over 36,000 acres of land and earned a gross assessed revenue of Rs. 2,01,500. This shows an increase of 40 per cent. in the area irrigated and of 24 per cent. in revenue when compared with the average of the previous three years. The increase was due to more demand for water on account of scanty rainfall during the year.

Krishna Canal.

- 183. The Krishna Canal is the only Major Work in this Division. It takes off from the left bank of the Krishna River from a weir built near the village of Khodsi in the Karád Táluka of the Sátára District and is 36 miles in length.
- 184. Certain improvements to the Khodsi weir which were sanctioned in 1916 with a view to increase its capacity of storage have been postponed owing to the abnormally high price of iron, etc., required for the work. The work will be resumed when normal conditions are restored. The expenditure already incurred on this work amounts to Rs. 59,100 against the estimated cost of Rs. 85,226.
- 185. During the year silt was removed from miles 15 to 20 at a cost of Rs. 1,585. The work of repairing the damage caused to the canal by the heavy rains of 1917-18 was also completed at a cost of Rs. 2,580. The canal irrigated 8,127 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 84,774.

Gokak Canal.

- 186. The most important of the first class Minor Works in this Division is the Gokak Canal. This irrigation system consists of a masonry weir across the Ghataprabha River at Dhupdal in the Belgaum District and a short length of canal taking off from the reservoir formed by the weir.
- 187. The weir crest (2,985 feet in length) was as usual temporarily raised by 2 feet at a cost of Rs. 1,296 in order to increase the storage of water for the rabi season. In spite of scanty rainfall full storage up to the crest of the raised weir was obtained. Generally this level is maintained nearly for two months, but in the year under report owing to scanty rain and consequent low discharge in the river it did not continue even for a week. The additional storage of 256 millions cubic feet thus obtained was found very useful for the irrigation of the rabi crop.
- 188. The Mills at Gokak are to be supplied with water at the rate of 146 cusecs for 13 hours a day (except Sundays) for which the Mills pay to Government Rs. 14,313 per year. But in the year under report, owing to the low water level in the reservoir the supply was reduced to three-fourth of the usual quantity on the 20th and 21st March 1919 and to half from the 4th April to 27th June 1919.
- 189. The existing arrangements to supply the pumping engine of the Madras and S. M. Railway Company with water for which the Company pays at the rate of one anna per engine watered subject to the minimum of Rs. 25 per month were continued during the year.
- 190. The water in the Dhupdal reservoir reached its lowest level standing at 18 feet above the sill of the sluices on the 15th May 1918. Thereafter the reservoir began to fill till 24th August when the water reached a level of 2.14 feet above the permanent crest of the weir.
- 191. The total rainfall was considerably below the average and nearly 3rd of it fell in the hot weather when it was not of any use, being untimely. The rainfall during the kharif and rabi seasons was very scanty and therefore the draw off from the reservoir commenced very early this year, i.e., from 17th December 1918, and thus there was shortage of supply for the perennial crops. By economical and judicious use of water, the supply to the perennial crops was, however, maintained till 29th March 1919, when there remained in the tank only 15 feet depth of water which was reserved for the Mills.

Revari and Chikhli Canals. 192. The only two works taking off direct from rivers without storage are the Revari and Chikhli canals in the Satara district. The Revaricanal is about 6 miles in length and takes off from above an ancient Bandhara situated on the river Vasna in the Koregaon táluka. The Chikhli canal is a small irrigation channel only 6½ miles in length and has its origin from the weir built in the Nandni River in the Khanapur táluka. These works irrigated over 600 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of about Rs. 3,500.

- 193. The improvements to the Dharma Canal which were sanctioned in 1909 were in Dharma Canal. progress during the year. Nine outlets have been completed and the regulator No. 8 is nearing completion. The outlay on "works" up to the end of the year amounted to Rs. 76,342 against the revised estimate of Rs. 77,798. The delay in the completion of this work is mainly due to the labour difficulty.
- 194. The crops under direct irrigation of the canal from miles 1 to 10 suffered owing to the insufficient supply of water in the canal due to the scanty rain and in the lower reaches below mile 10th the crops altogether failed. The water was admitted into the canal on the 24th June 1918 and the canal ceased to flow on the 1st December 1918.
- 195. Of the canals furnished with storage works the three most important are in the Yerla River Sátára district. The first known as the Yerla river irrigation works consists of the Nehr tank Irrigation works having a canal 8½ miles in length starting from the right bank of the river Yerla at the Nehr tank and two other canals, vis., the Yerla right bank, 15½ miles in length, and the Yerla left bank, 8½ miles long, starting from a pick-up weir across the Yerla river at Khatgun.
- 196. The Yerla river irrigation works irrigated an area of about 4,500 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 22,600.
- 197. The rainfall during the year was exceptionally poor and as water was given in the rabi season for growing food and fodder crops the perennial irrigation suffered considerably.
- 198. The Maini tank is the second system. The Maini tank canal derives its water Maini Tank supply from a large nalla that falls into the river Yerla in the southern portion of the Khatáo táluka. The canal is 9½ miles in length and irrigates lands in both Khatáo and Khánápur tálukas. It irrigated about 2,300 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 9,000.
- 199. The Upper Man River Works is the third system referred to and consists of a tank  $U_{pper Man}$  River at Pingli which supplies the right bank canal, 4 miles in length, and also a distributary on the Works. left side, vis, Dahewádi canal,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles in length. Both of these tail into the Gondaola canal (7 miles in length) which has an independent origin at a weir across the Man river. Lower down the river the Lodhavada canal ( $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles) has its source. This system irrigated an area of 1,100 acres and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 5,600.
- 200. The remaining works are all small tanks mostly in the Dhárwár district and they Other works, irrigated from 55 to 900 acres.

#### (ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

- 201. Most of the second class irrigation works are in the Dhárwár district and on them depends the success of the important rice cultivation in the hills. During the year repairs to 79 tanks were carried out and the expenditure on them amounted to Rs. 51,000 against Rs. 37,000, the average of the previous three years.
- 202. The total area irrigated by these works was about 79,500 acres and the irrigation share of the gross assessment amounted to Rs. 1,80,500.

#### 5.—SCIENTIFIC WORKS.

#### (a) Engineering questions that have arisen.

- 203. Observations to ascertain loss by evaporation and absorption were made by means of iron tanks in the Pathri, Ashti and Ekruk tanks.
- 204. Locking arrangements to the outlets under the Ashti Tank were provided to prevent irrigators from taking canal water unauthorisedly.

#### (b) Special Irrigation District.

- 205. During the year a small area of ratoon cane (Khodwa) was irrigated near the Septic Tanks, Septic Tanks with effluent. The pumping plant installed to pump water from the Mutha Hadapsar, Poona. Right Bank canal to this area has now been removed, as it has been found that water dilution is not absolutely necessary. It has been decided to use the Septic Tank area in future as a safety valve area on to which the effluent can be diverted in case of emergency.
- 206. Total area irrigated under the Septic Tanks was 63 acres and the revenue derived therefrom Rs. 1,228.
- 207. The work of remodelling Distributary No. 5 of the Mutha Right Bank Canal is Remodelling Distributary No. 5. The work of remodelling Distributary No.
- 208. The experimental farm on Distributary No. 5 was completed during the year. Experimental farm. Sugarcane, fodder crops, vegetables and pan garden were grown on the farm.
- 209. Contouring.—The area of 70,000 acres commanded by the Nira Left Bank Canal Nira Left Bank between Haturna and Vadapuri Nalas was contoured during the year out of the whole area of Canal. 93,350 acres to be contoured under this canal.
- 210. Nala Surveys.—Sub-soil and Nala surveys to study the sub-soil conditions were continued during the year at a cost of Rs. 1,592. It was found that superficial classification alone which was completed for the perennial section of the Nira Canal did not give sufficient data for reclaiming lands by deep drainage and it is essential to have a sub-soil

survey of all areas in order to enable the location and opening up of old drains. This survey was therefore started and is in progress in the following selected areas under the Nira Left Bank Canal:—

- (1) Area between Distributary 23 Branch and Distributary 25.
- (2) Land drainage of area of the catchment of nala passing through culvert 28.
- (3) Land drainage of the catchment of culvert 29.
- 211. Nala clearance in salt-affected land.—The experimental work of reclaiming the salt-affected area near Baramati was continued during the year. This consisted of excavating new trenches and deepening the existing ones to drain off the sub-soil water.
- 212. The subjoined comparative table of water levels shows the results of the experiments carried out:—

Godavari Canals.

- 213. The work done during the year under report was chiefly sub-soil survey, the surface classification, however, was done simultaneously of about 26,548 acres in 17 villages under the Godavari Right Bank Canal.
- 214. For sub-soil work the areas chosen were by drainages and not by villages. Various drainage areas were taken in hand and sub-soil sections were run along and across the nalas. Pits were carried down to a porous strata either massive kankar or murum. Fifteen areas thus selected were surveyed during the year and from the data collected schemes of drainage are being prepared.

### (c) RIVER GAUGING.

- 215. The gauging operations were continued at the 39 stations instituted on some of the rivers in the Deccan.
- 216. The observed discharges for the year 1918-19 were the lowest on record due to low rainfall. The results are published in the "Annual Report of the supplies of water available for irrigation works, etc."
- 217. As usual a training class was held in Poona where practical instructions and demonstrations were given to the old and new gauge karkuns before they commenced work on their respective gauges.
- 218. Arrangements for the establishment of additional rain gauges within the catchment areas of Lake Beale and Kadwa at Palkhed in the Násik Irrigation district have been made, as the existing ones are not sufficient for determining the real average of the rainfall over the catchments in question.
- 219. The several rain gauges in the Belgaum and Sátára districts were maintained as usual during the year by the respective Executive Engineers.

### (d) EXPERIMENTS ON THE EFFICIENCY OF CANALS.

- 220. Another annual publication gives a record of observations for the flow and losses in canal, the quantity of water used for irrigation and the loss from tanks.
- 221. Occasional notes are written upon the saturation of earthen dams and the rate of deposit of silt in tank basins for which observations are being made continuously.
