Sir,

A full report of the Stamp Administration of the Bombay Presidency covering the triennial period ending 31st March 1905 having been submitted last year, I have the honour to submit the following brief summary and statistics of the Stamp Revenue collected under all heads during the year 1905-06.

2. An important change was introduced in the year under review in the separation of the Sind Treasuries from the control of the Bombay Depôt and the establishment of an independent Stamp Depôt at Karáchi to supply, in addition to the Sind Treasuries, certain Treasuries in the North-West Frontier Provinces and the Punjab. This change was brought into force from the 15th of July 1905, and although from the beginning of the year up to that date the control of the Bombay office over the Sind Treasuries was allowed to continue, statistics for the broken period in respect of those Treasuries have been furnished to the Karáchi Office and will be dealt with by it independently of this office. The Treasuries transferred in this manner number only 4, and as the total revenue from them was not very considerable, the transfer has not resulted, as the following figures will show, in any material difference in the gross revenue for the Presidency proper.

3. I regret that want of punctuality on the part of District Treasury Officers and the supply of statistics in an incomplete state has again hampered the preparation of the general review within the required time. The Treasuries in fault are—Sátára, Kánara, Belgaum, Dhárwár, and Ahmednagar.

STATEMENT No. I.

4. The gross receipts for the year were Rs. 56,33,148 including recoveries under both the Indian Stamp Act and the Court Fees Act. In the preceding year the gross receipts amounted to Rs. 64,10,840, but in this year the receipts of the 4 Sind Treasuries, amounting to Rs. 7,08,611, were included. Excluding that amount the year under report shows a decrease of Rs. 69,081 when compared with the previous year, which, it may be noted, was the best on record. Realizations under the Indian Stamp Act rose by Rs. 1,51,151; the revenue for the year 1905-06 amounting to Rs. 26,65,325 against Rs. 25,14,174 for the year 1904-05, exclusive of Sind figures. On the other hand there has been a drop of Rs. 2,20,231 in the revenue from 'Court Fees'; the total for the year under report being Rs. 29,67,823 against Rs. 31,88,054 in the preceding year. The difference is attributable to the fact that the revenue for the year 1904-05 contained an item of Rs. 2,02,070 on account of Probate duty paid on the estate of Mr. J. N. Tata, whereas no such windfall was received during the year under notice.

5. It is worthy of remark that to the total increase in the stamp revenue Bombay City alone has contributed Rs. 1,30,762, a distinct index of the rise in the commercial prosperity of the City.

6. The realizations from the sale of Postage and Telegraph stamps both to the Bombay Administrative Offices and by the District Treasuries, as also from the issues of all descriptions of stamps to the Central Provinces and the Berars and the Bombay Political Agencies, have as usual been excluded from the present review.

7. With the rise in the revenue from General stamps additional 'charges' have had to be paid, the increase under the Indian Stamp Act amounting to Rs. 11,079 and that under the Court-Fees Act to Rs. 32,686. The total disbursements under the former head amounted to Rs. 1,34,729 against Rs. 1,23,650 in the previous year and those under the latter to Rs. 1,34,644 against Rs. 1,01,958. These charges are made up of refunds of duties, the cost of administration and the discounts paid.

STATEMENT NO. II.

8. The decrease under 'Court-Fees' has already been explained in paragraph 4. Over one-third of the total recoveries were made in Bombay City. Khándesh, with a revenue of nearly Rs. 3,00,000, retains second place, but most of the other Treasuries show a falling off, due presumably to a decrease in litigation.

STATEMENT NO. III.

9. The increase of Rs. 1,51,150 in the revenue received under the Stamp Act is made up of increases under all heads except One Anna stamps, Notarial stamps and Miscellaneous receipts.

10. The sum total of the revenue derived from these two heads amounted in the year under review to Rs. 18,56,189. The revenue for the preceding year from the same source amounted to Rs. 17,02,785. Bombay City, with a revenue of Rs. 8,37,898, as usual, takes the lead and during the year under report shows an increase of Rs. 86,881. In most of the Districts the rise was well maintained, Khándesh in particular showed a large increase.

11. The revenue from this source during the year has also helped the rise under 'General Stamps' to the extent of Rs. 26,416.

12. The improvement under this head amounted to Rs. 2,036. Out of the total proceeds amounting to Rs. 98,939, Rs. 97,413 were collected in Bombay City alone, only Rs. 1,464 being realized in Aden.

13. The total realizations from the sale of One Anna Receipt Stamps amounted during the year to Rs. 1,55,436 against Rs. 2,68,541 during 1904-05, a decrease of Rs. 1,13,105. The falling off in the revenue under this head is nominal as the sale of these stamps was stopped under the orders of the Imperial Government from the 1st October 1905, ordinary Postage Stamps of the value of One Anna and Half Anna taking their place.

14. It may be noted that, notwithstanding the substitution of Postage Stamps for 'India Revenue Stamps,' One Anna revenue stamps on skeleton forms and cheques will continue to be embossed as heretofore in the General Stamp Office at Bombay. The revenue from this source has amounted to Rs. 69,451 during the year under notice as compared with Rs. 66,252 during the preceding year.

15. The briskness of the Bombay Share Market and the prosperity of the local mills is clearly evidenced in the rise in the revenue derived from the sale of Share Transfer Stamps from Rs. 65,059 during 1904-05 to Rs. 1,48,485 during the year under review. Of the total revenue under this head Bombay City was responsible for Rs. 1,35,536.

16. The increase under this head amounted to Rs. 6,250, the revenue for the year being Rs. 23,500 against Rs. 17,250 during 1904-05.
17. Notarial stamps or stamps for the use of Notaries Public at the two chief centres, Bombay and Aden, show realizations amounting to Rs. 1,404 against Rs. 1,520 in the preceding year, a decrease of Rs. 116.
18. Miscellaneous receipts show a fall of Rs. 10,361. They comprise several items, chief amongst which is the composition of stamp duty charged to the Improvement Trust and Port Trust and the Bombay Municipality when debentures are issued by these public bodies. Rs. 38,500 realized in this manner formed part of a total recovery amounting to Rs. 68,641. The balance of these receipts is made up of duties and penalties realized under the Stamp Act and of fees paid for adjudicating the stamp duty on documents.

STATEMENT NO. IV.

19. In consequence of the reduction in the number of licenses by two and the withdrawal of India Revenue Stamps, the allowances on account of discount amounted to Rs. 84,252 as compared with Rs. 85,053 during the preceding year.

STATEMENT NO. V.

20. The bulk of insufficiently stamped or unstamped instruments on which duty and penalty became leviable under the Stamp Act, was dealt with by the Bombay Office, the total number being 400 against 368 in the year previous.

STATEMENT NO. VI.

21. Twelve prosecutions for the infringement of the Stamp Law were instituted during the year under review against five during the preceding year. Thirteen persons were brought up for trial, eight convictions were secured, and there were five acquittals. The fines imposed amounted to Rs. 126 in the aggregate.

STATEMENT NO. VII.

22. The majority of the cases noted in this statement belonged to Bombay City. Out of a total of 499 Bombay cases reported to the Collector, action was taken in no less than 386, and in 33 cases additional duty amounting in all to Rs. 3,848 was charged. In four cases penalties were imposed, amounting in the aggregate to Rs. 210.

23. The total sum recovered on account of 'Deficit Court Fees' in the whole Presidency was Rs. 6,423, an increase of 75 per cent. over the figures for last year.

24. Mr. Balkrishna Wassoodew Pandoorang has been in charge of the office of Assistant Superintendent throughout the year, and has performed his duties to the complete satisfaction of my predecessor and myself.
